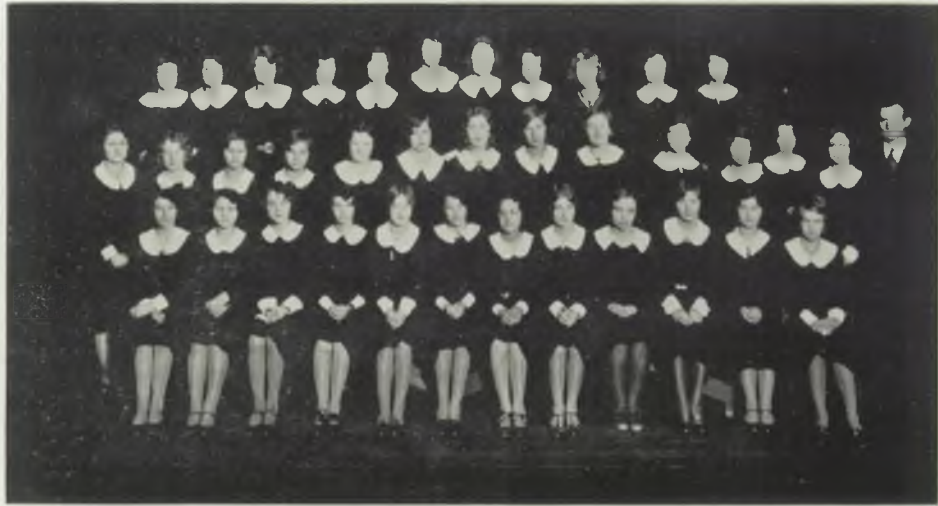

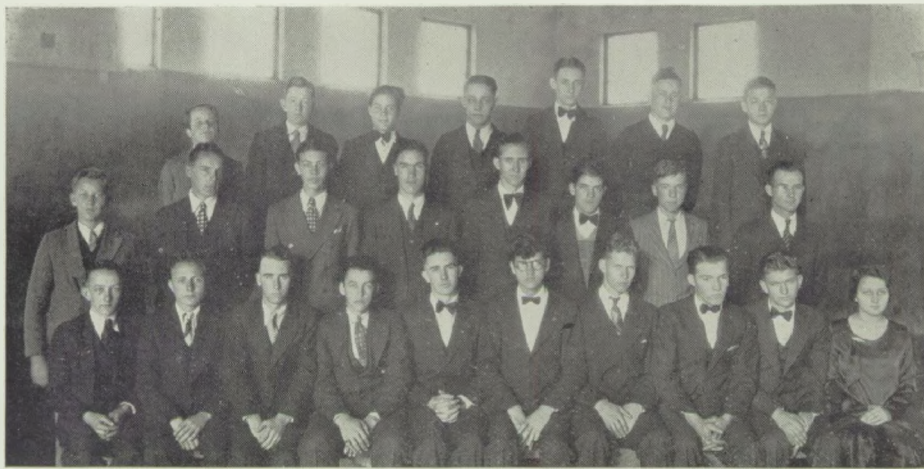

Girls are trained to be home makers of the highest type, and this is accomplished by the courses of planning, preparing and serving of meals; selection, construction and care of clothing; family relationships and home care of the sick. A course in Related Science is given to teach the underlying principles of the science of home life.

Our course is planned to include home project work for each member of the class, in order that classroom work may carry over into the home life of every girl.

Vocational Agriculture in Missouri is steadily growing, new schools are being added every year. There are now one hundred and thirty-three high schools in Missouri offering Vocational Agriculture.

The work offered in Voc. Agriculture fits the boy who wants to farm immediately or go to the Agriculture Colleges for Specialized training. Each boy carries out a supervised practice program fitted to the needs of the individual farm and to the boys own interests. Cameron High School is always at the front with sow and litter and baby beef projects. Last year C. I. Ward Jr., was the winner of the Mo. Ruralist contest making the best average of any boy ever to enter the contest.

Livestock Judging is stressed in the advanced classes and last year the Dairy team was third at Columbia with Charles Ellwood fourth high individual in the State.

The Future Farmers of America is a new organization of Vocational Boys. There are four degrees in the organization based on accomplishments. The Green Hand or first degree is open to first year students. The Future Farmer Degree is given to those Green hands who have earned twenty-five dollars and productively invested the same, can recite the "Future Farmers Creed" and lead a group discussion for ten minutes. The other degrees, State Farmer and American Farmer are much harder to attain. Regular meetings are held, a program of work is adopted and regular officers are elected each year.
