Vorntional Agriculture in Missouri is steadily growing, now schools are heing added every year. Thore are now one humbed and thirty-three high shook in Missomri offering Vocational Agriculture.

The work offered in Voce Agriculture fits the bey who wints to fin'm immellately or go to the Agriculture colleges for Suediazed training. Each loy carries out a suldervised bractice formam fitted to the needs of the individual farm and to the loys own interests. (Gameron Hish school is alwass at the front with sow and litter and baby beef projects. Last year (. I. Ward Jr., was the winner of the Mo. Ruralist contest making the best average of any boy ever to enter the contest.

Livestock fotging is stressed in the advanced classes and last wear the bairy team was third at Columbia with Charles Ellwood fourth high individual in the State.

The Future Farmers of America is a new organization of Vocational Boys. There are four degrees in the organization based on aromplishments. The Green Hand or first degree is open to first vear students. The Future Fiarmer Degree is given to those fireen hands who have earned twenty-five dollars and productively invested the same, can recite the "Future Fammers ('reed" and lead a group) discussion for ten minutes. The other degrees, state Farmer and American Farmer are much harder to attain. Regular meetings are held, a program of work is alonted and regular officers are elected enth rear.
