This year the Mystic staff is trying very hard to make a better Mystic than ever before, so that you will have pleasant memories of school activities from glancing through your Mystic of 1951.

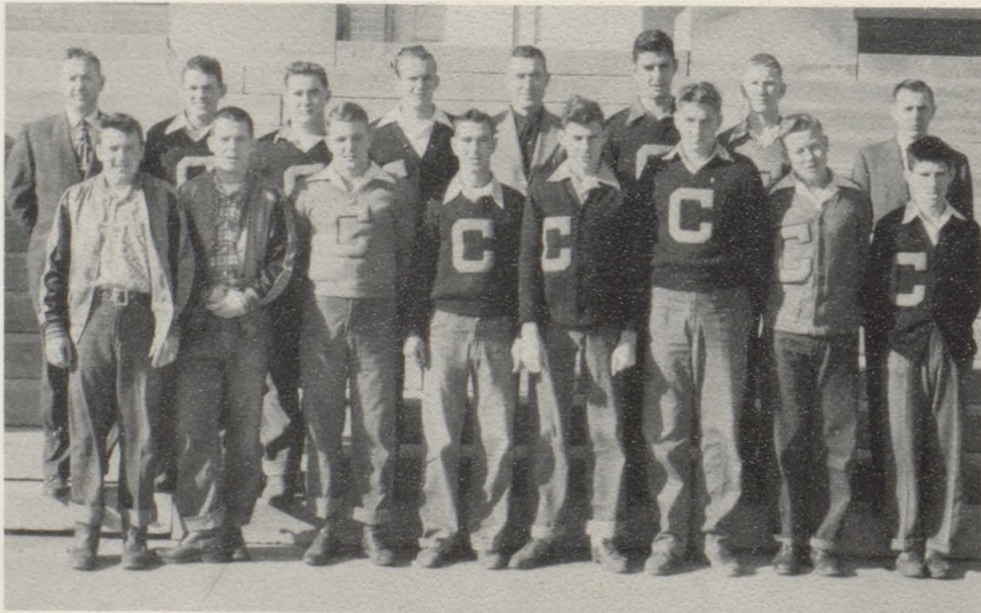

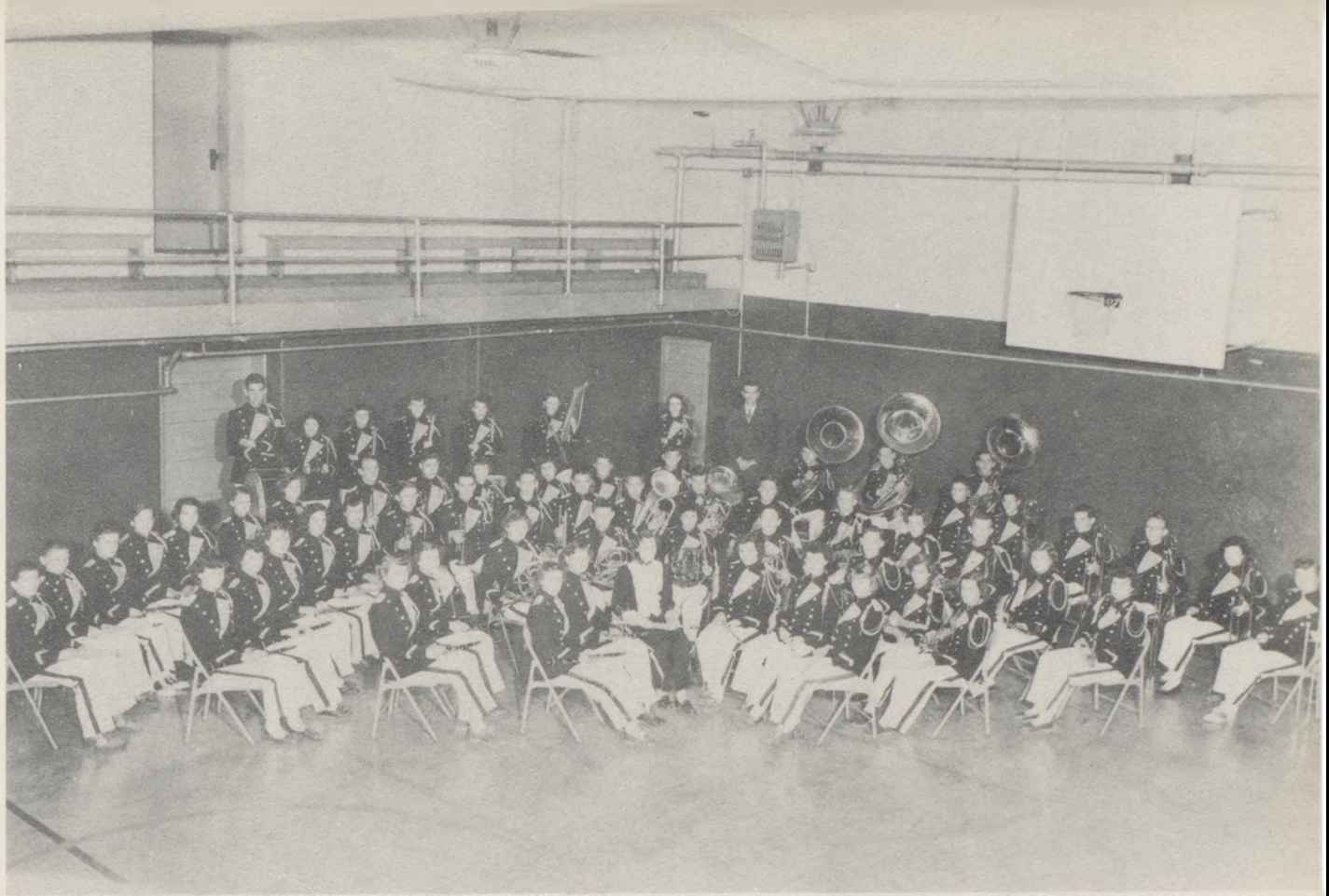
Cameron high school is honored to be one of the first in the state of Missouri to present the diversified occupations program to its students.
