The floats were judged and a prize of \$2.50 was given by the Student Council. The "A" Club won the prize.



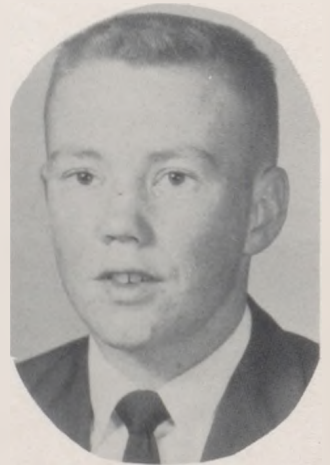
