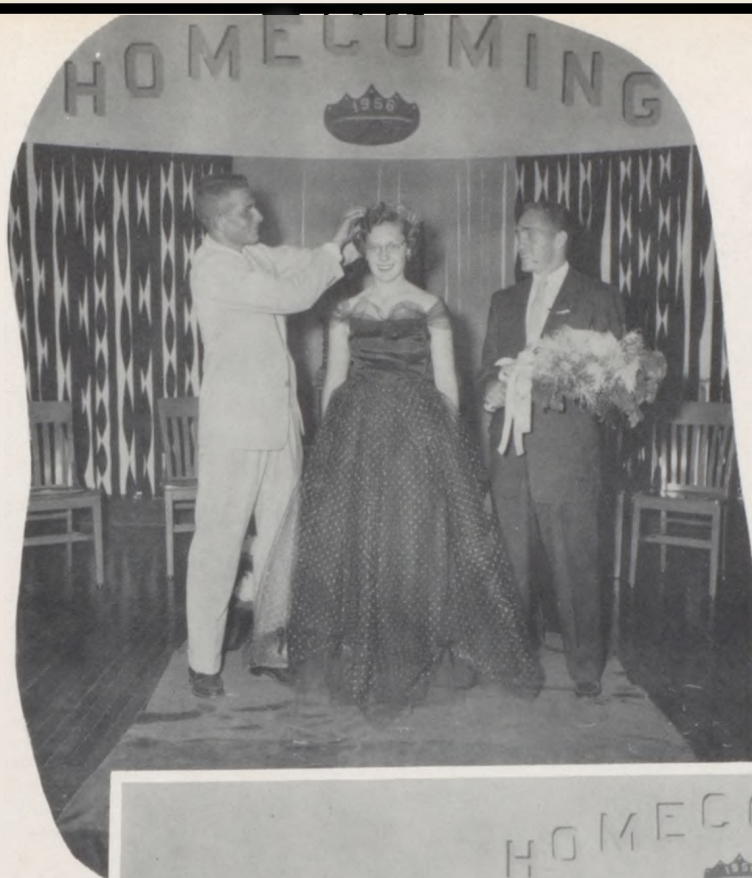

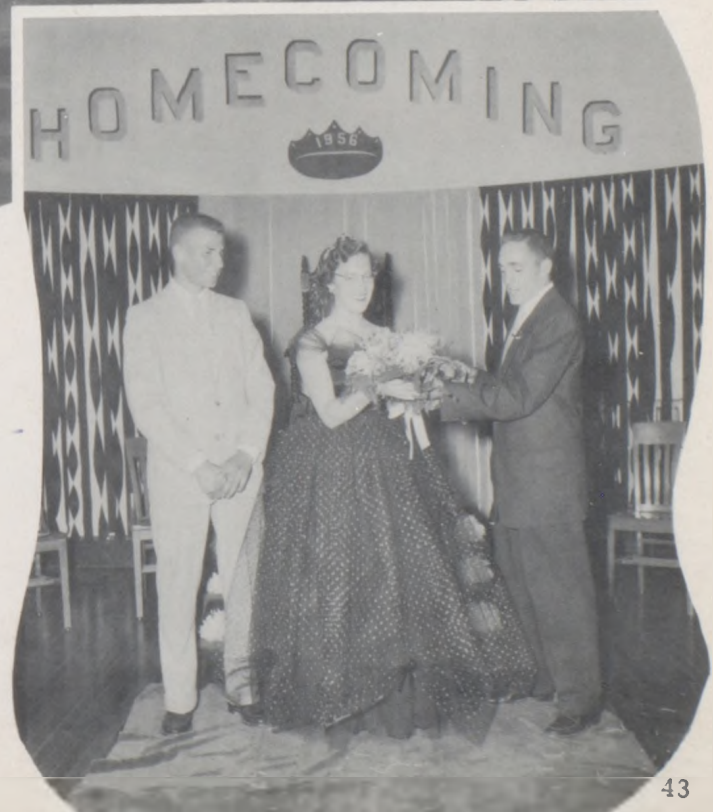

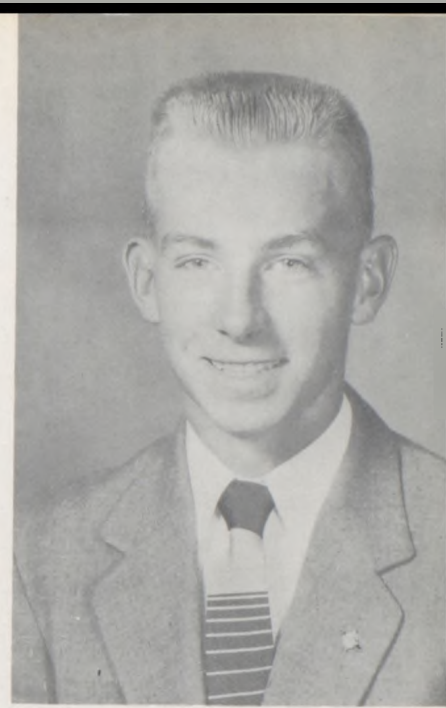
The Student Council sponsors all exchange assemblies and class assemblies. It is in charge of all Homecoming festivities, the Christmas gift exchange and Christmas dance.
