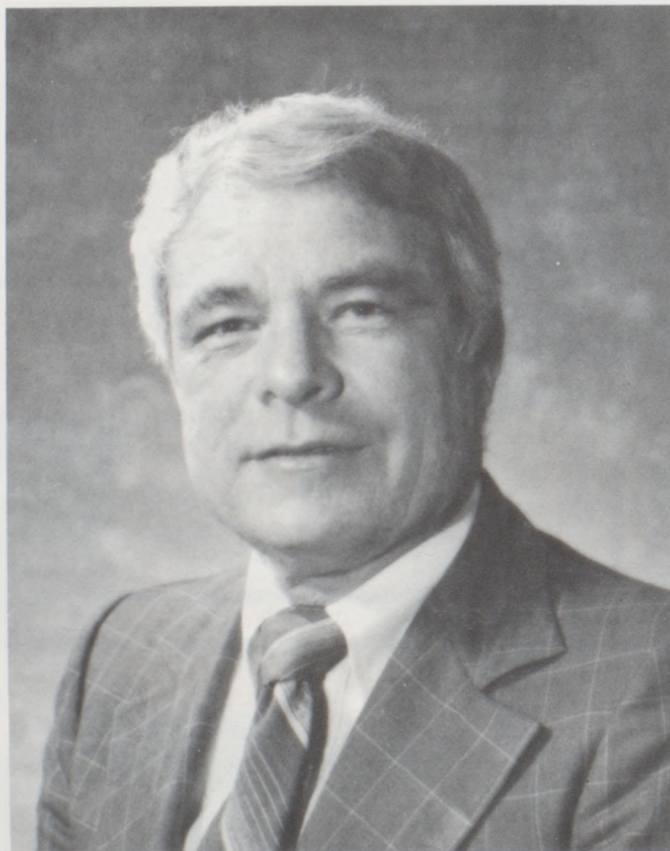
## Administration

# Warms Audience



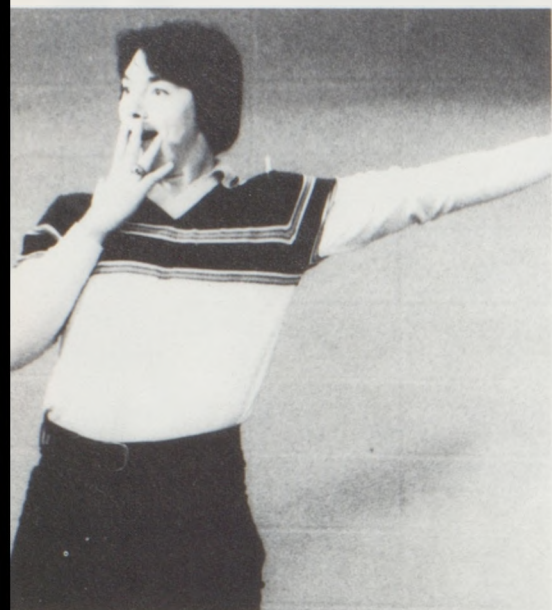

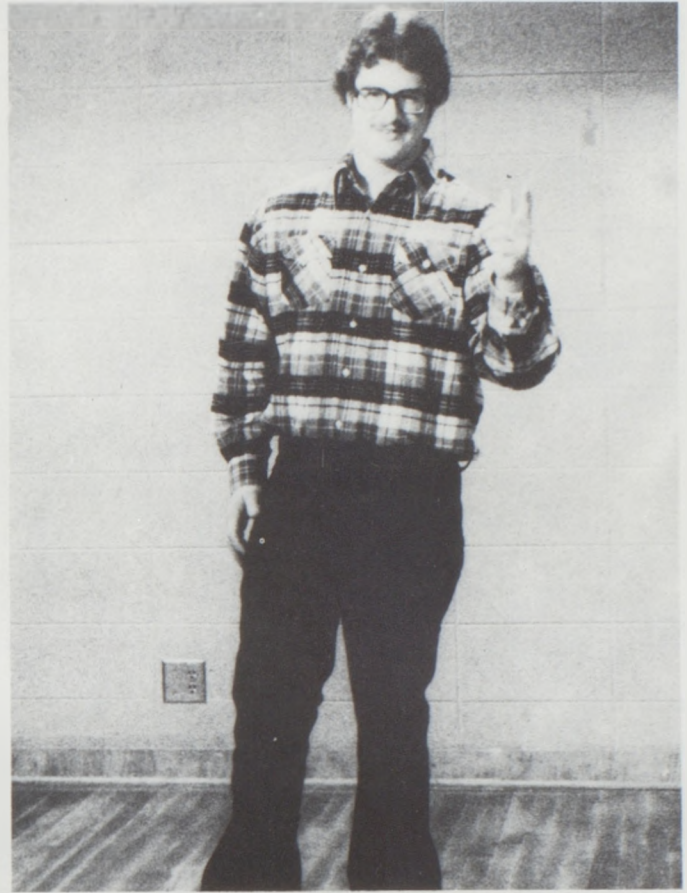

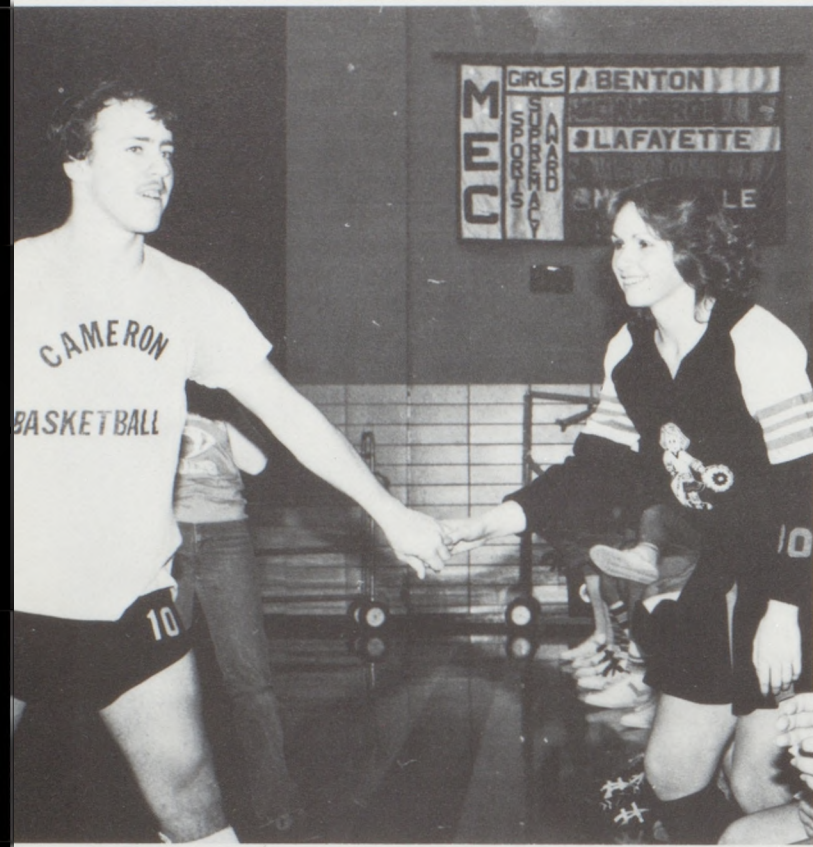

The Junior class was presented with the Spirit Stick during the Winter Sports ceremony for having accumulated the most points during Spirit Week.



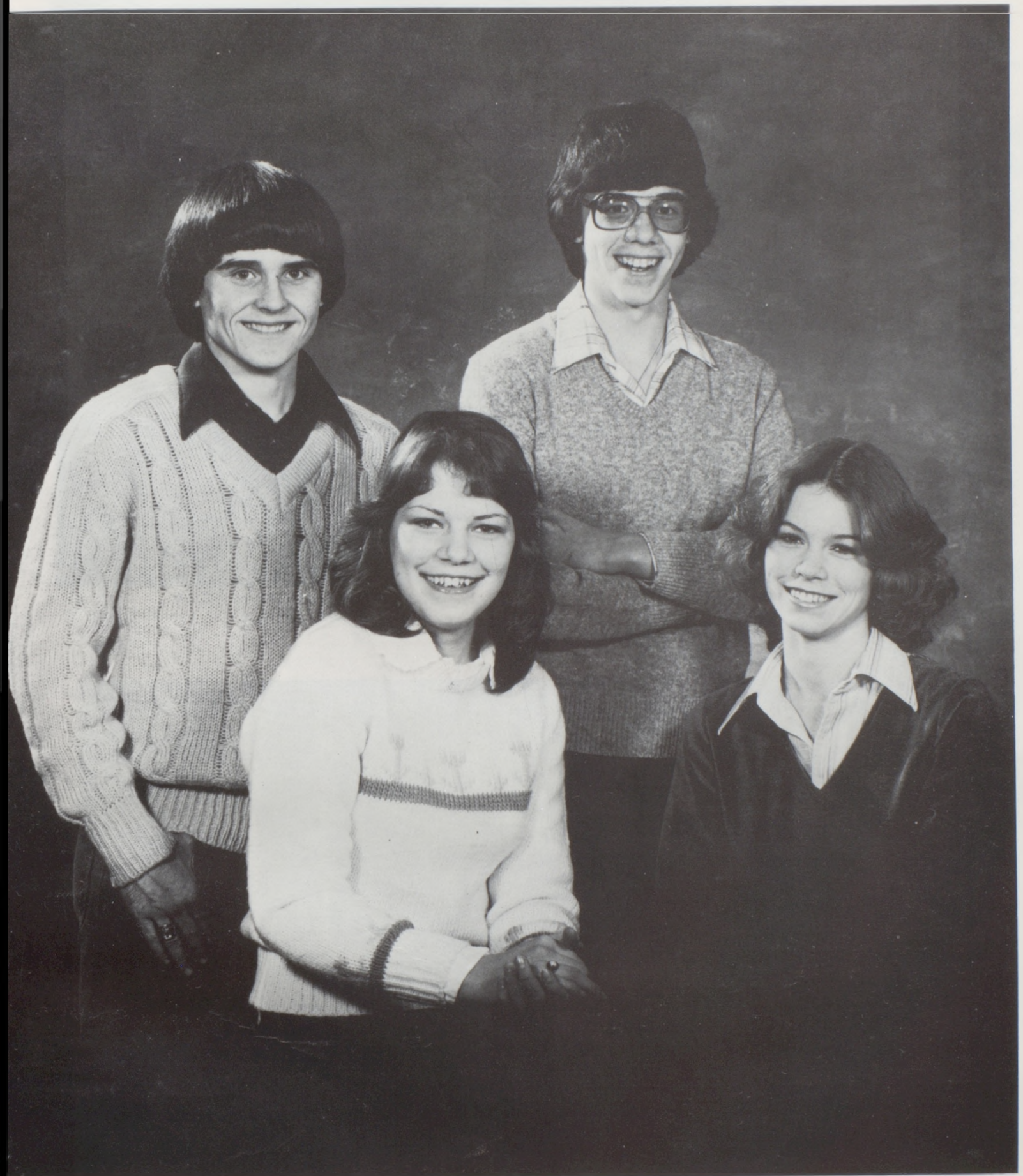

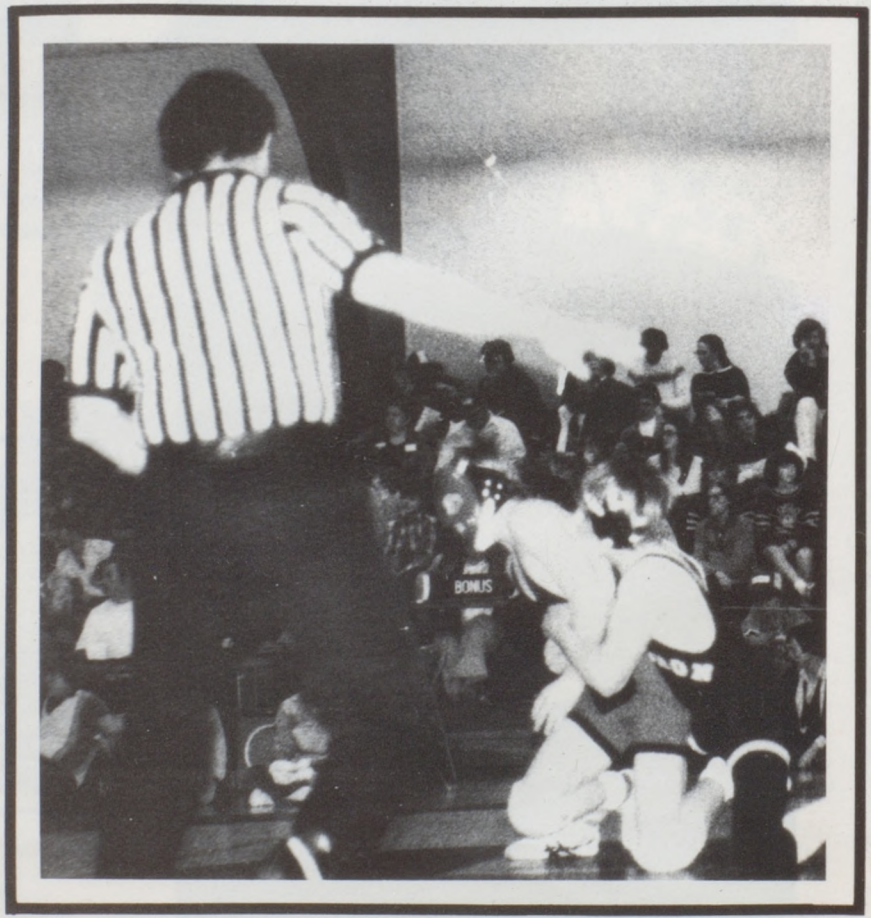
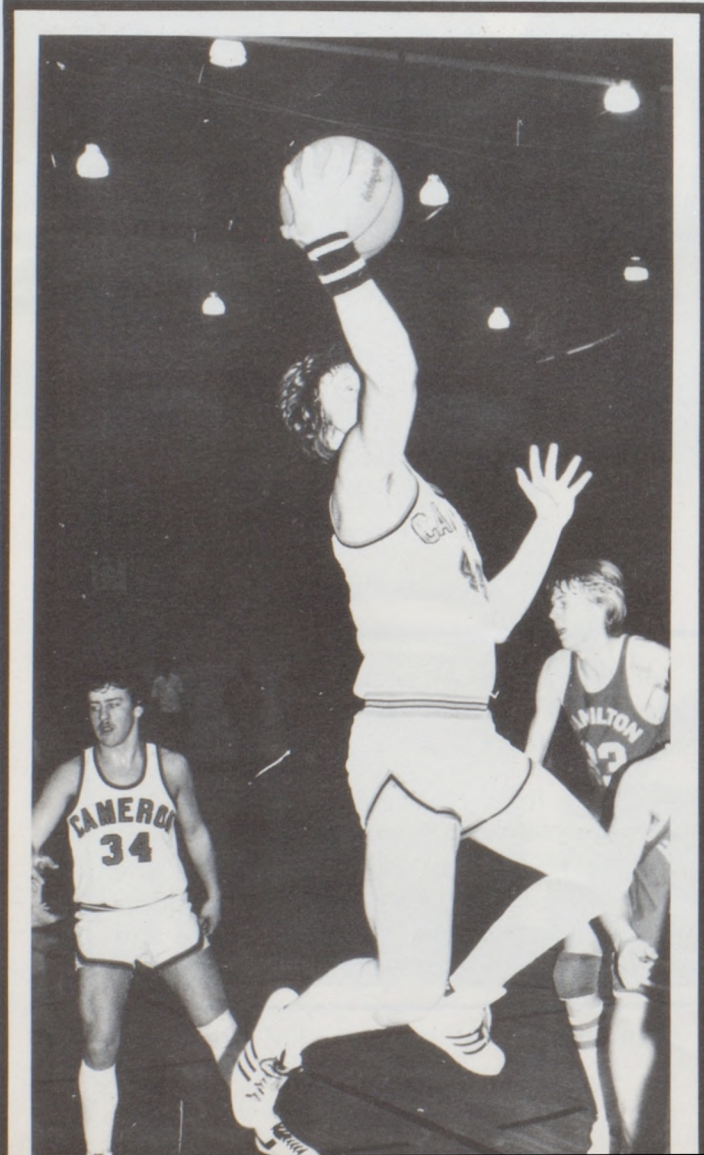
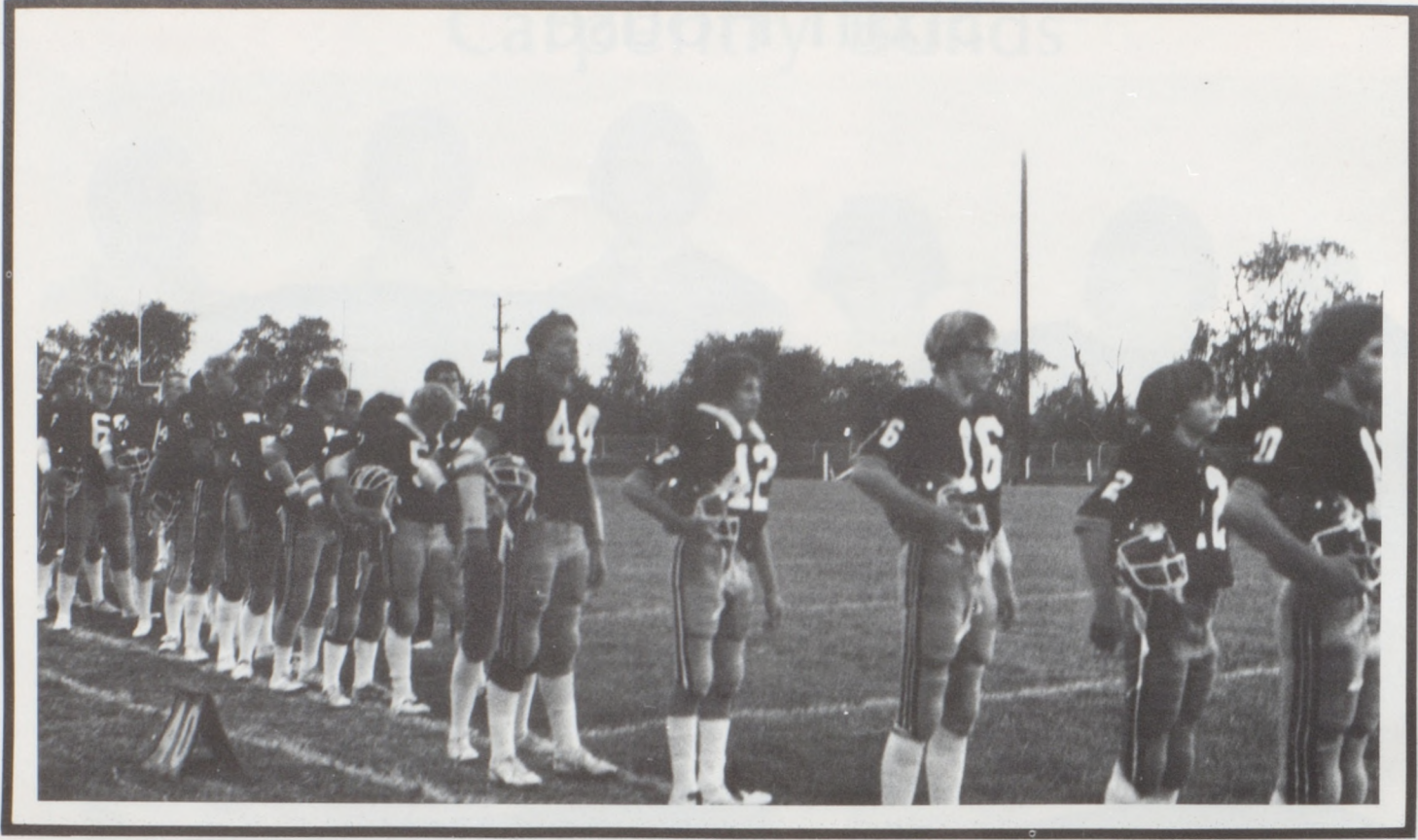
# Sixth House
