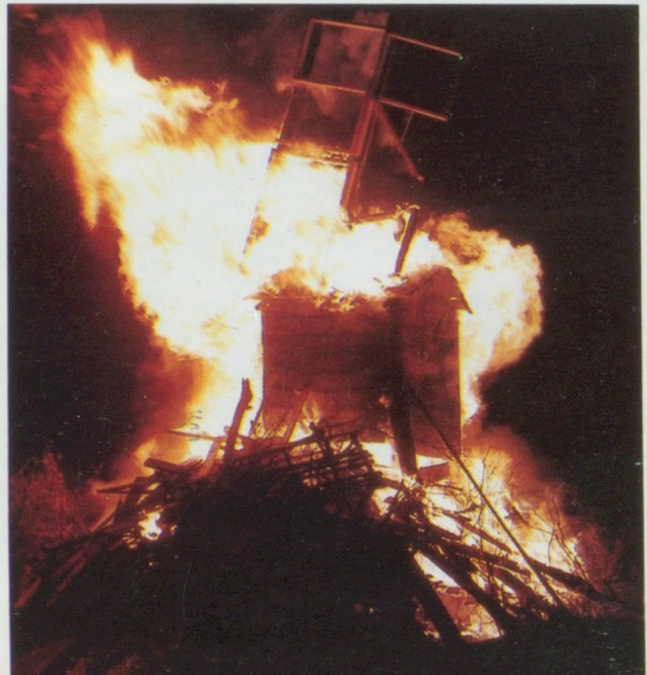

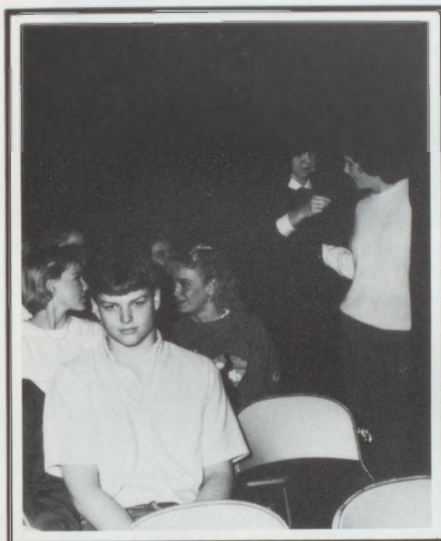

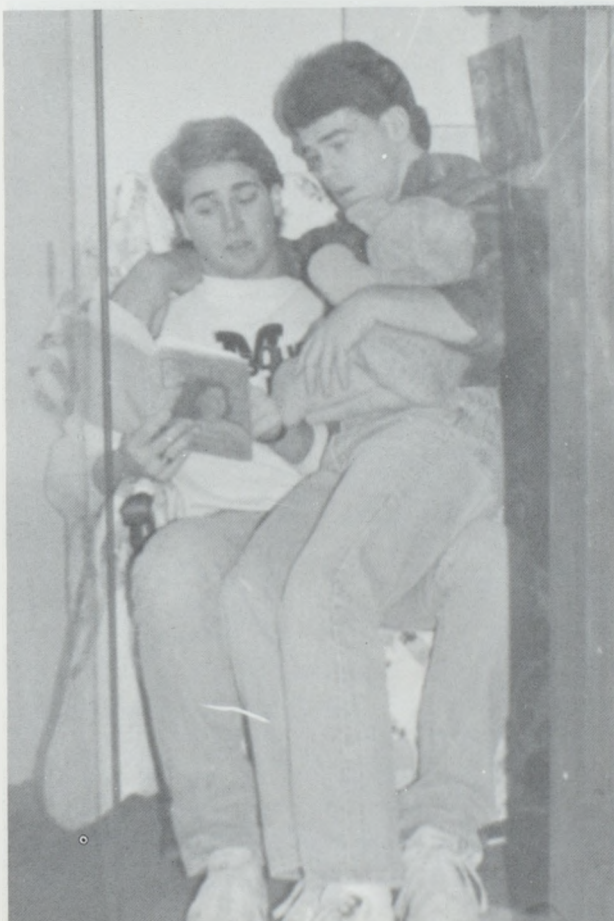
The Cameron Chapter of Future Teachers of America presented the teachers at Cameron High School with carnations of appreciation during National Education Week.

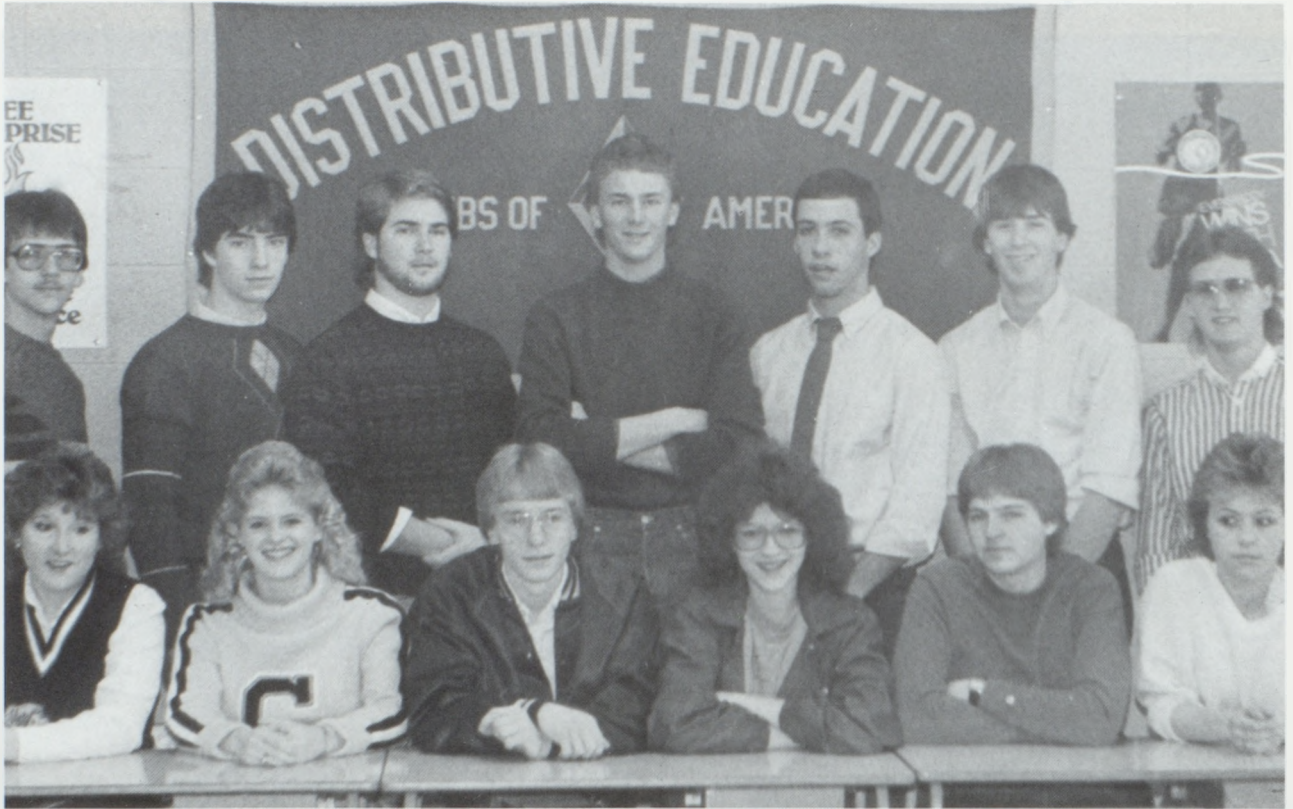

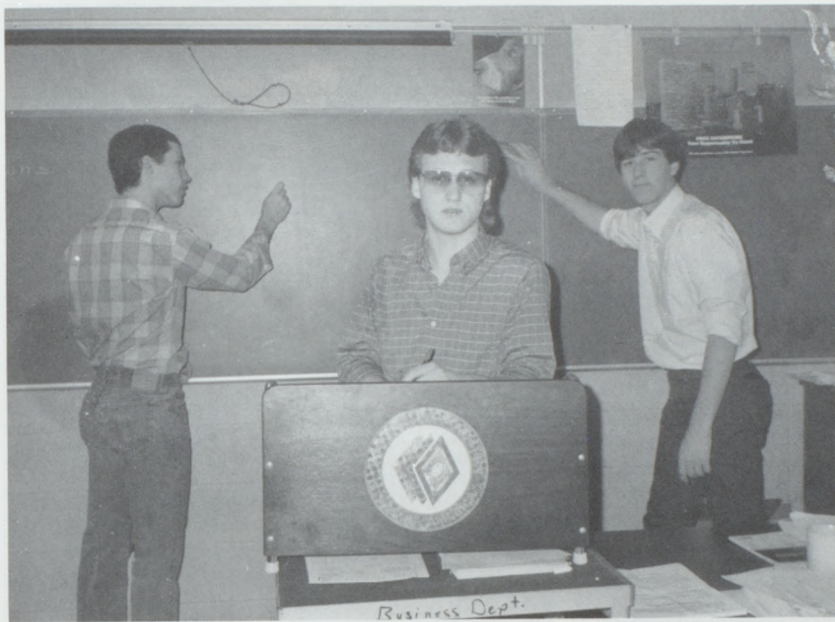

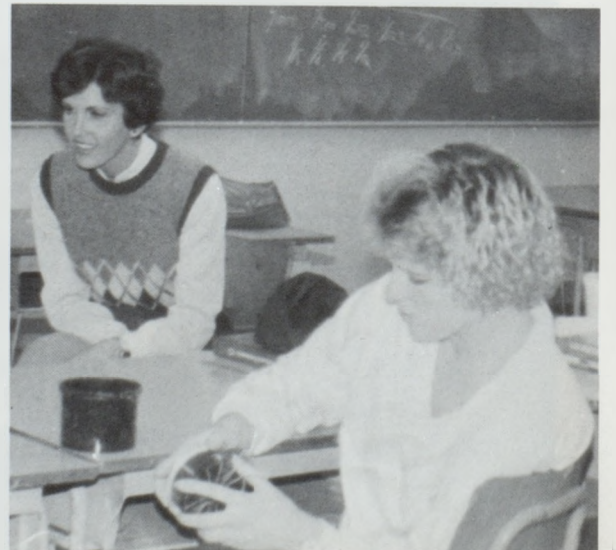

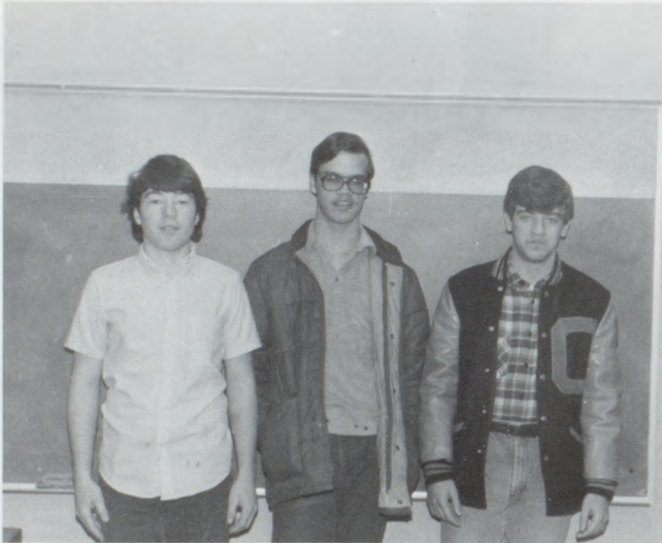

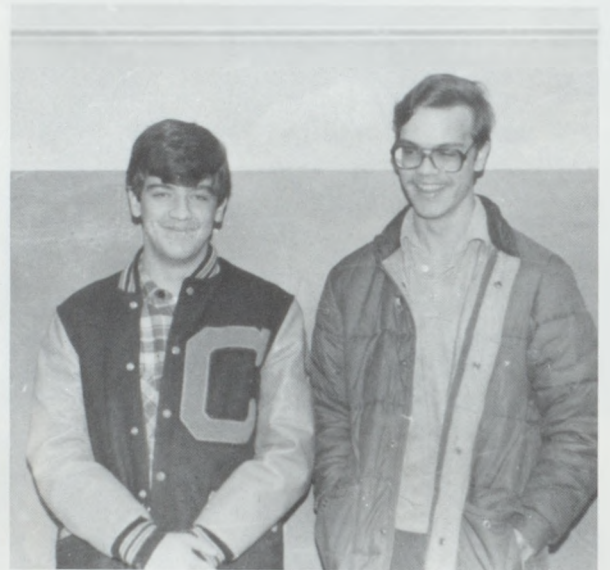

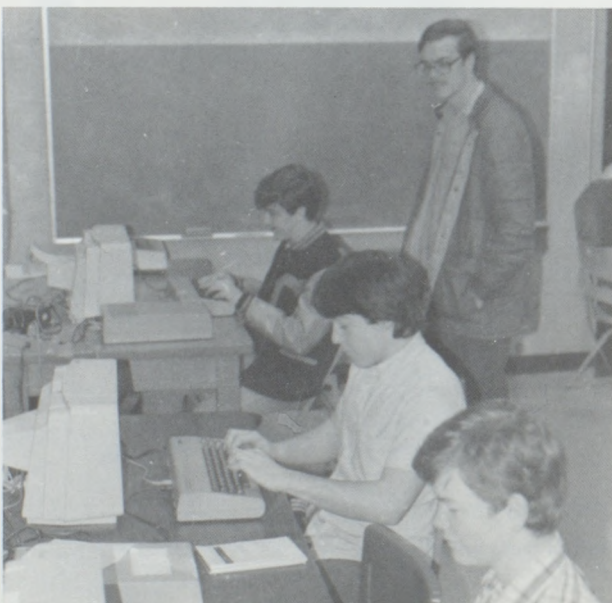

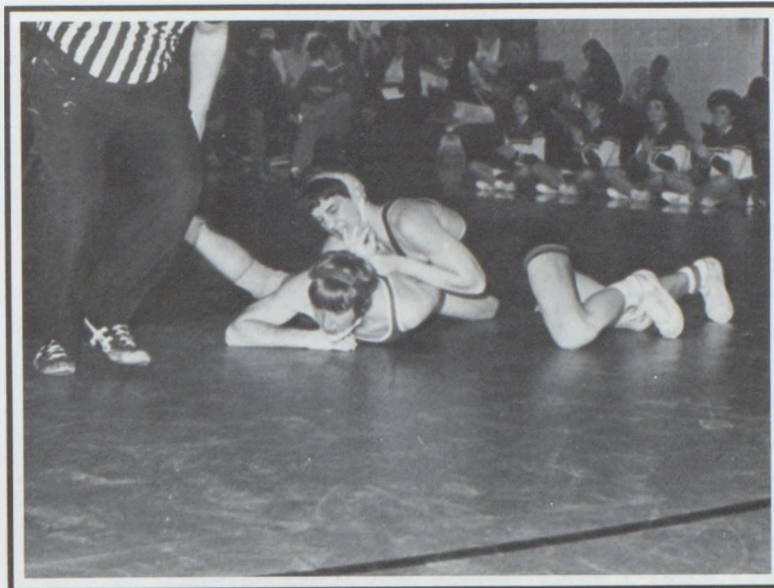

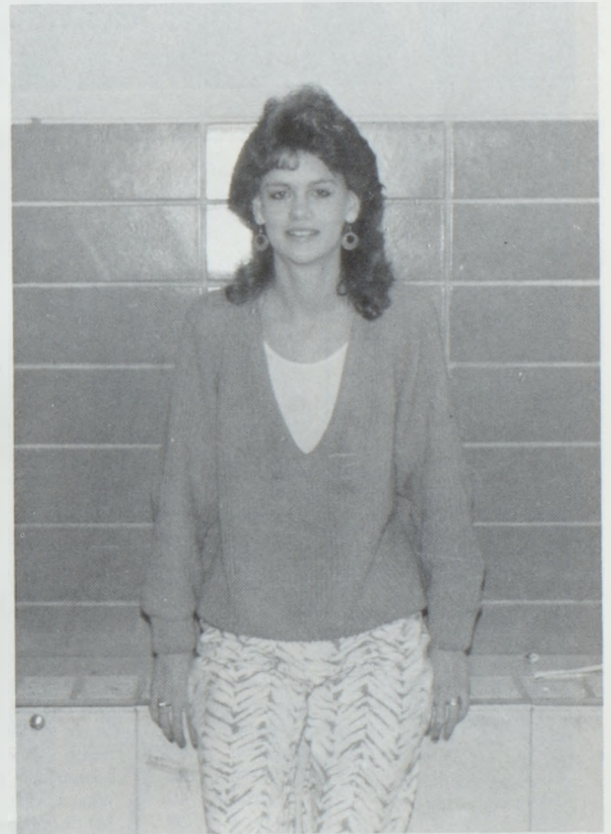
