











SADD BEGINS NEW CHAPTER




The Cameron Sertoma Club presents \$250 to SADD.

SADD has four goals: To help eliminate the drunk driver and save lives. To alert high school students to the dangers of drinking and driving. To conduct community alcohol awareness programs. To organize counseling programs to help students who may have concerns about alcohol.

In the 16-24 year age group, alcohol is responsible for 8,000 deaths a year and the disfiguring of 40,000 young people. REMEMBER — Friends don't let friends drive drunk!


