Mark Baker provided the music for the Homecoming Dance held in the gym.



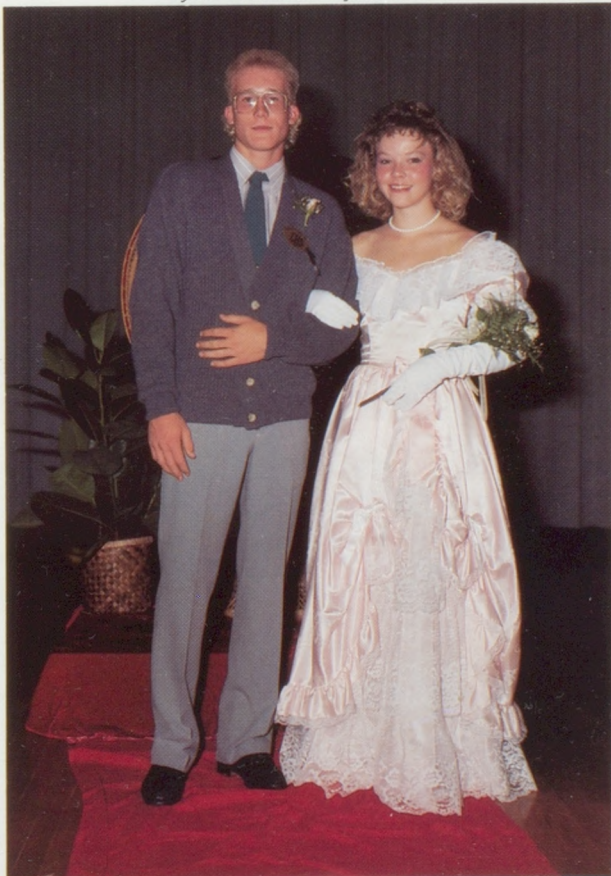

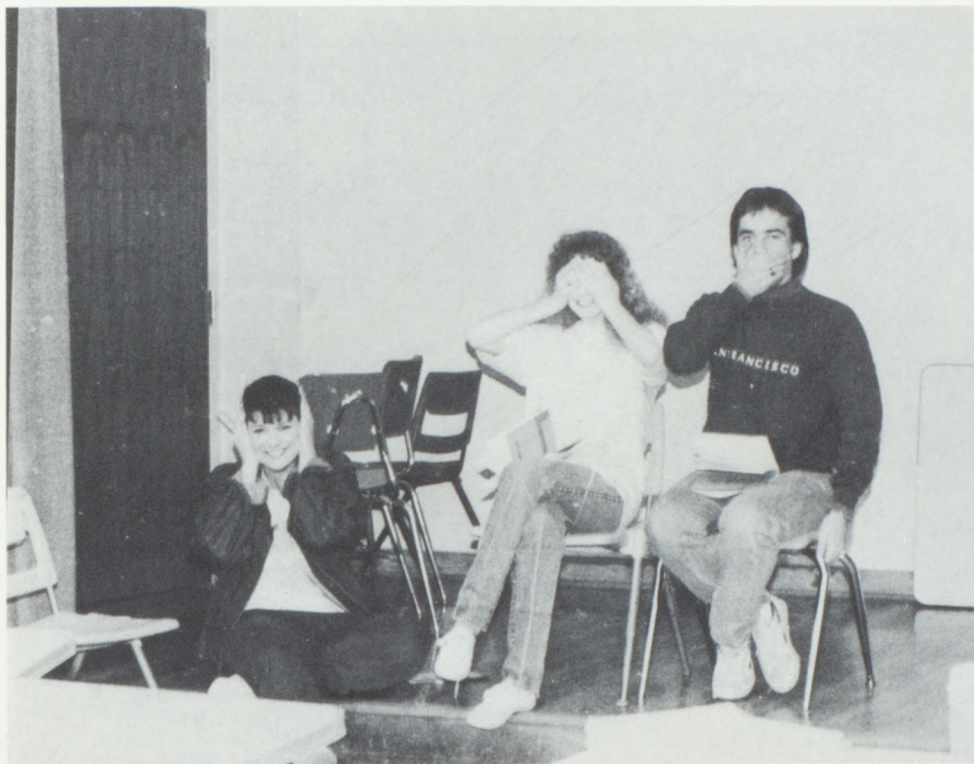

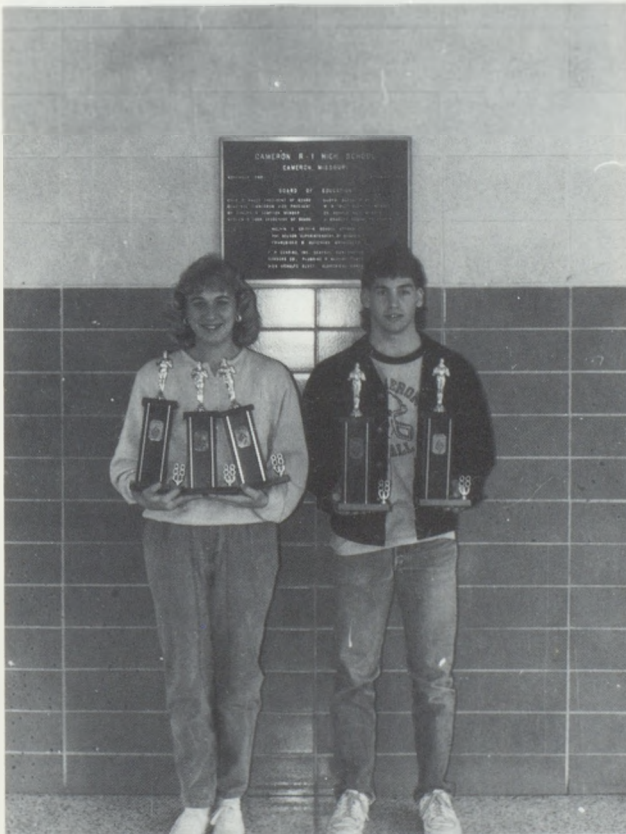

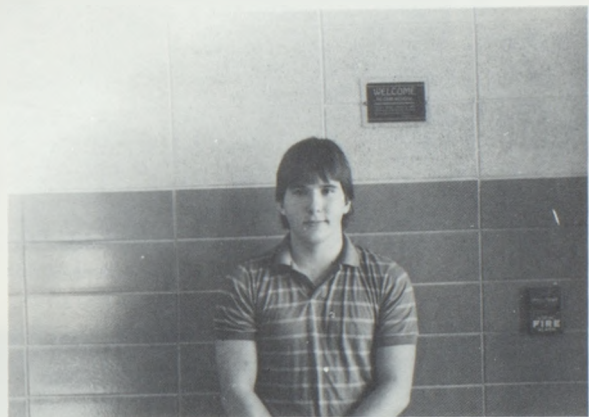

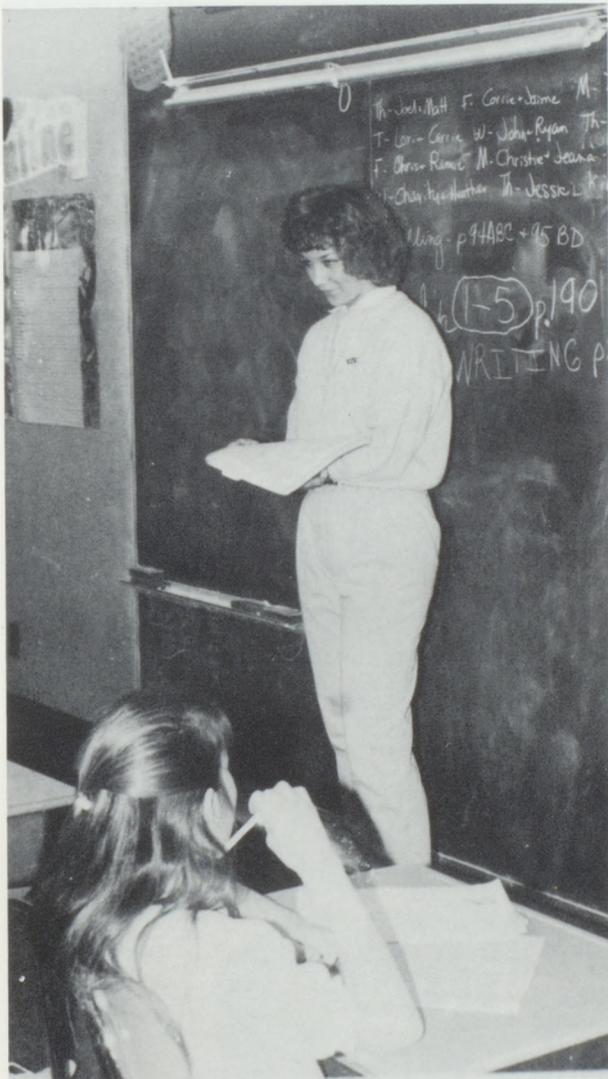

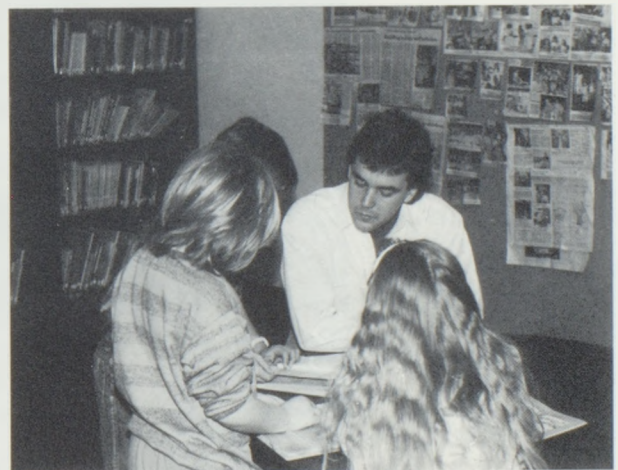

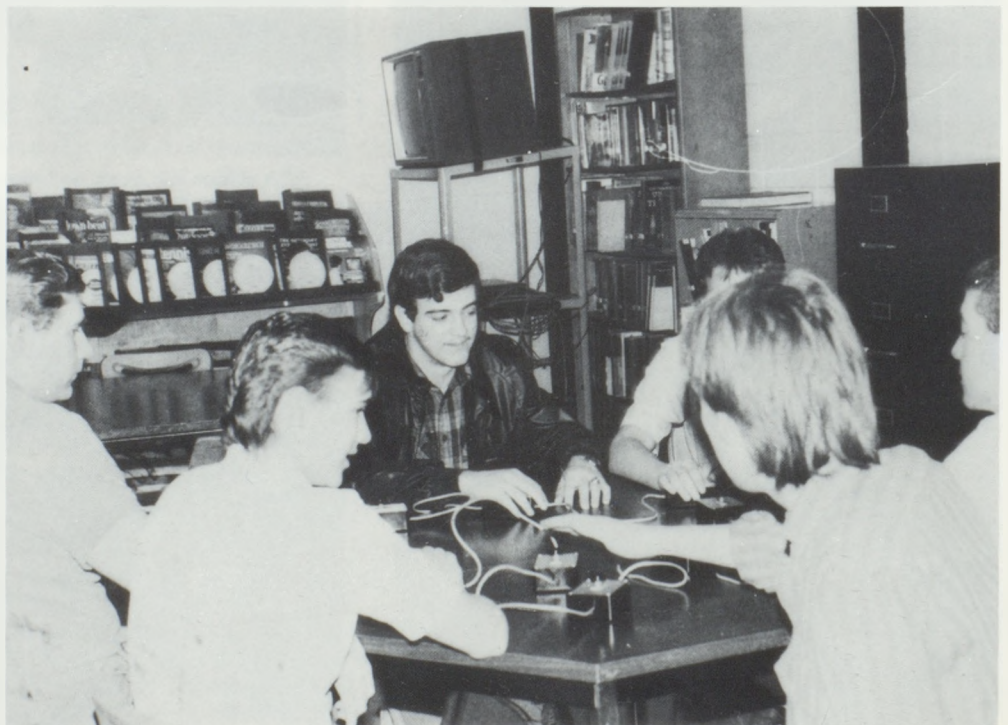

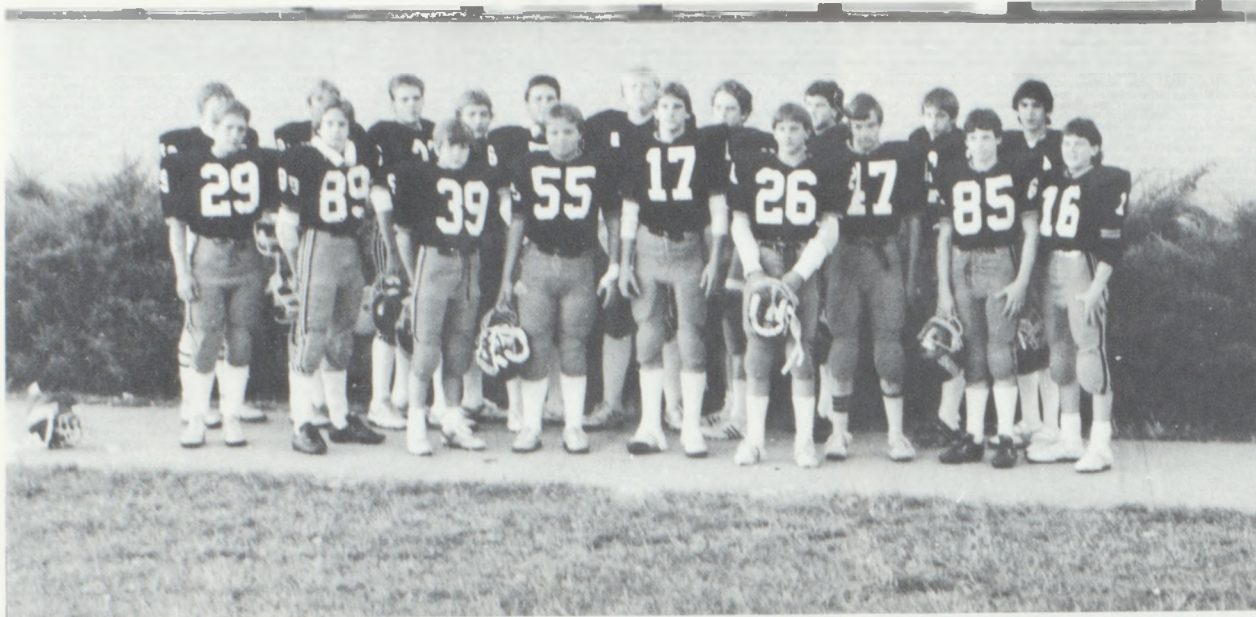

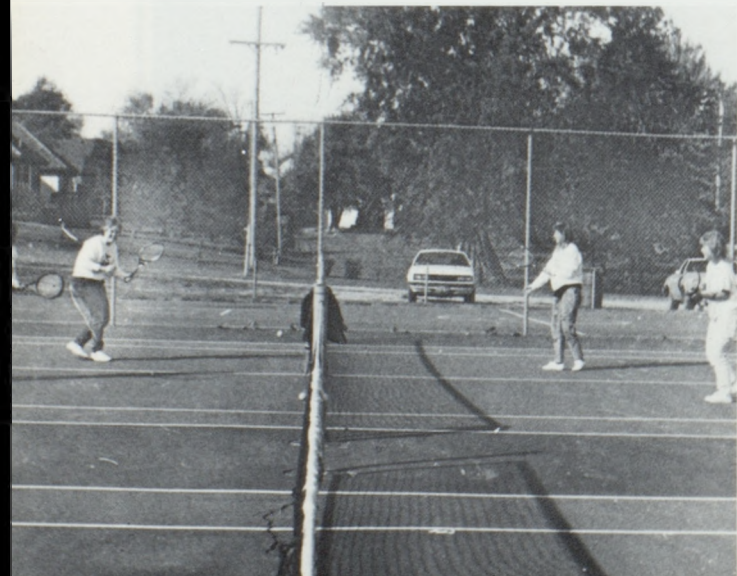
