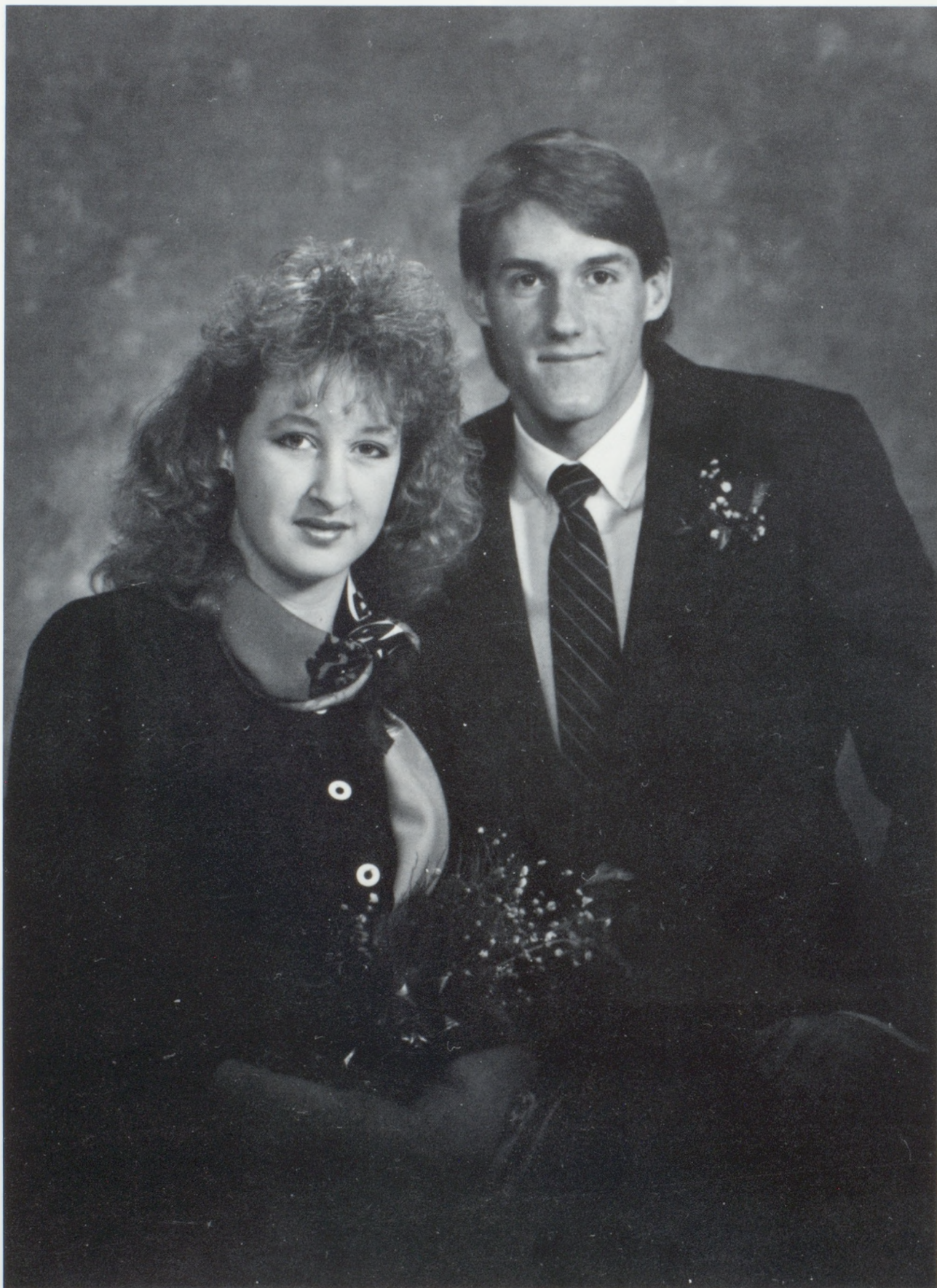
On December 4 and 11, Goodrich Auditorium played host to "Fantasticks", a musical comedy/drama about a young couple tricked by their mothers to fall in love.
