

Dragons Finish 5-5

After winning their first two games against Mid Buchanan and West Platte, things were looking good for the 1990 Cameron Dragons. The Dragons then suffered their first loss to the class 3A Pleasant Hill team.

After their first loss, things just didn't seem to click for the Dragons, due mostly to the number of injuries that the Dragons were plagued with throughout the season. The Dragons played Smithville for the 1990 Homecoming game and came up short of the win by three points.

Cameron won their fifth game of the season against East Buchanan and then suffered their two worst losses of the year against the Platte County Pirates and the North Platte Panthers.

The Dragons headed into their first district game with a 4-3 record and would defeat the Lawson Cardinals to bring their overall record to 4-4 and their district record to 1-0. In their second district game, Cameron would face the Lathrop Mules, who had a record of 7-1. Cameron played one of their best games of the season to beat Lathrop and move their district record of 2-0. Cameron then lost to the eventual sectional champs, the Plattsburg Tigers, to end their season with a 5-5 record.
















Wild Bill Hickock (John Worland).








Although the Symphonic Band has had some trouble with vandalism, they managed to pull through and keep it all together.

When the high school library needed bar codes ap-





Future Problem Solvers

For the past 15 years, students from all over the United States and the world have been participating in the Future Problem Solving Program, tackling some of the most complex challenges facing society. These challenges have ranged from those with an emphasis on science to those orientated toward the humanities.

Each year the program focuses on five different topics. These are selected by tens of thousands of students around the world who vote for the topics of greatest interest to them.

The offerings and the materials of the program have been refined over the years, but the problem-solving process is essentially unchanged:

1. Research and learn as much as possible about the general topic.

2. Brainstorm problems related to the specific situation presented.

3. Identify a major underlying problem from the list of brainstormed problems.

4. Brainstorm solutions to the underlying problem.

5. Develop a list of criteria by which to evaluate the solutions.
6. Evaluate the solutions according to the criteria to select the best solution.

The Future Problem Solving Program serves students K-12,

plus college students as well. Through experience and participation in Future Problem Solving, students are far better equipped to take control of their personal futures. Perhaps most important. participation in the program teaches young people that they can exert a substantial degree of control over decisions that affect their futures
