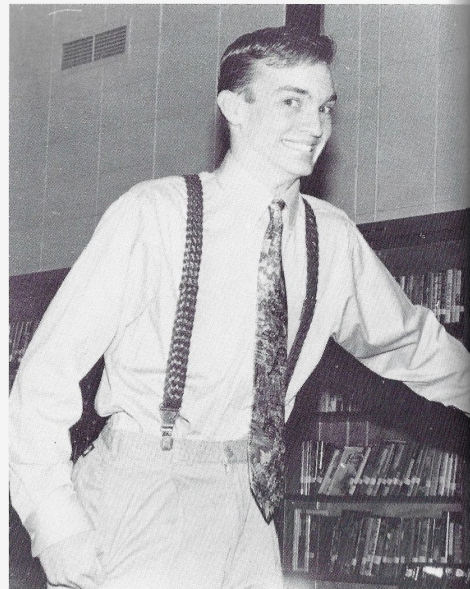
# Mystic Elections

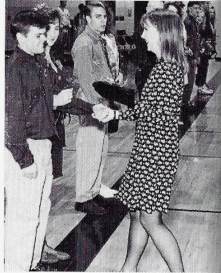
At It's Best.

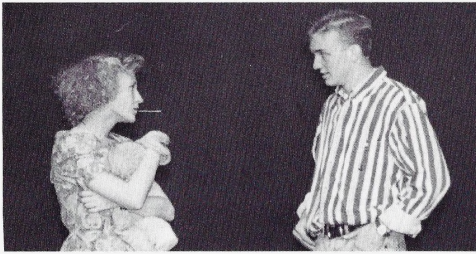
# Happy Daze

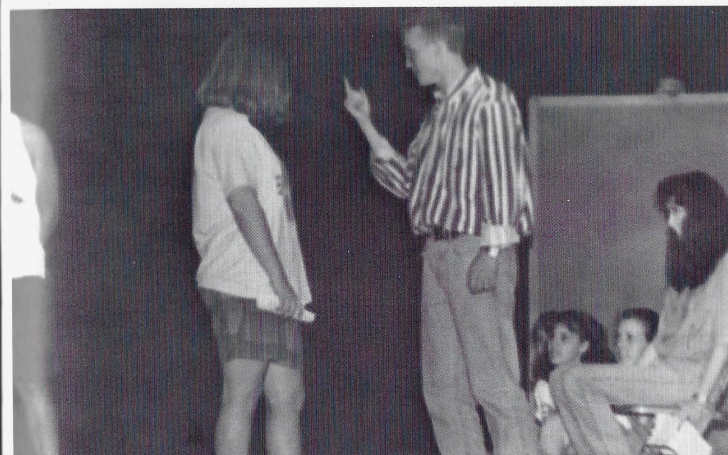
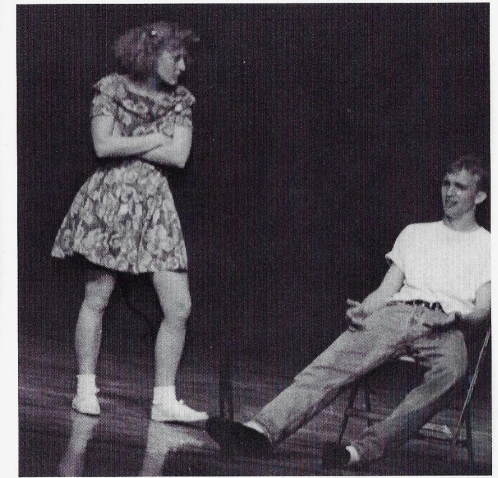

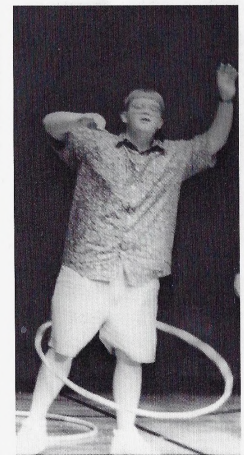

The spring sports finished the year with great pride and spirit. Each team continued the winning tradition of CHS sports.

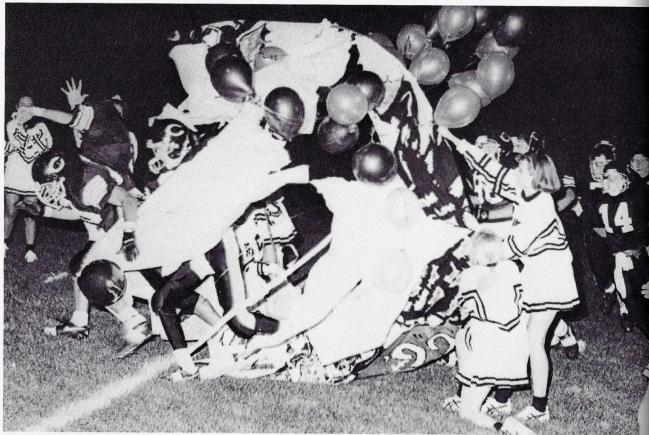

The East Buch game began with a bang. It would go down as one of the greatest games in Cameron Football history.

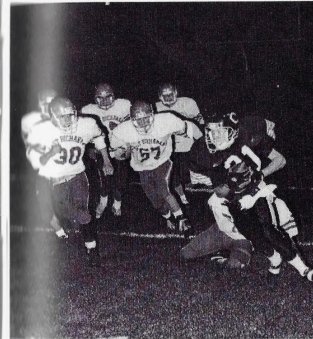

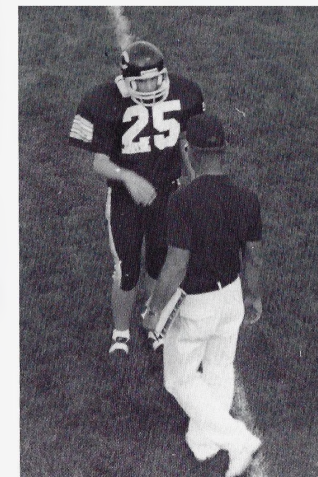

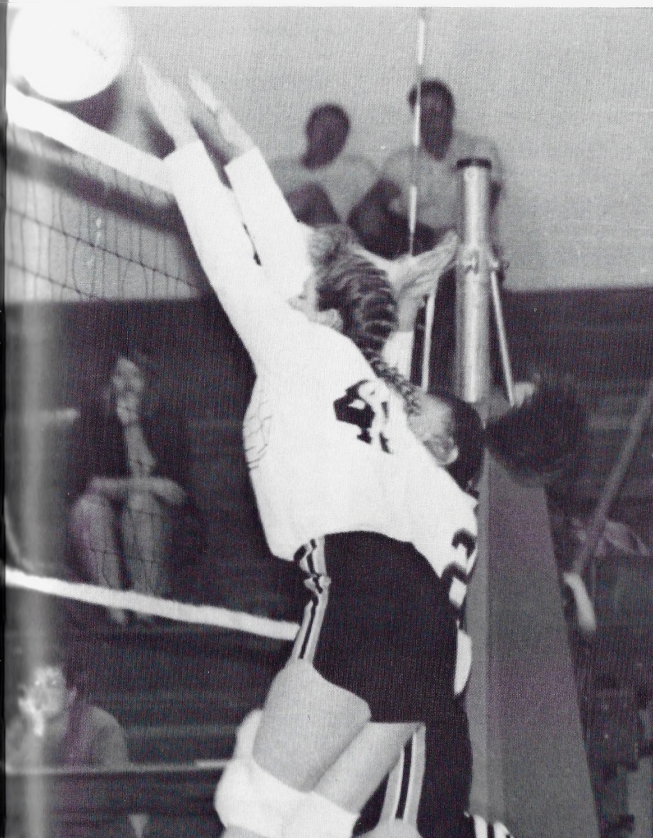

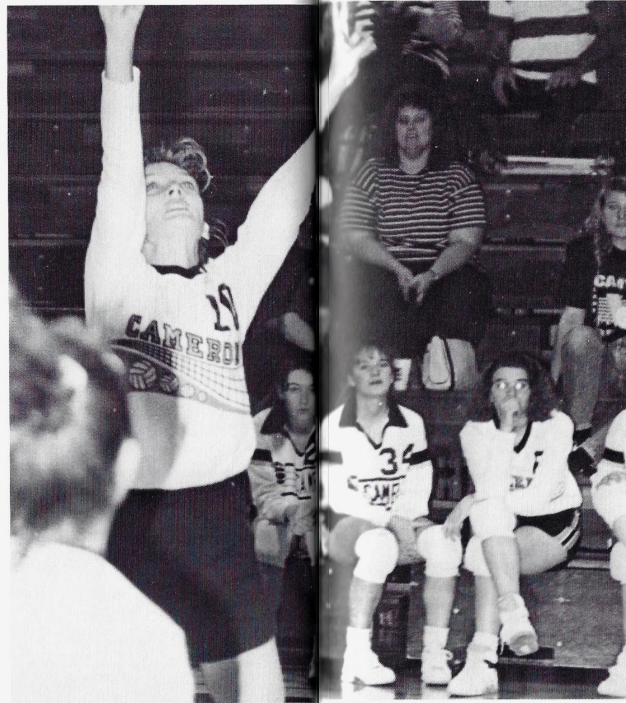

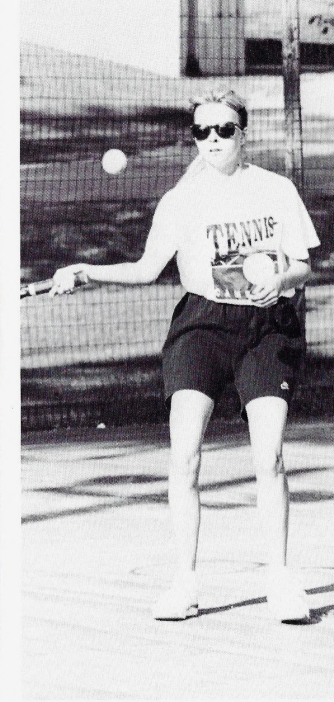

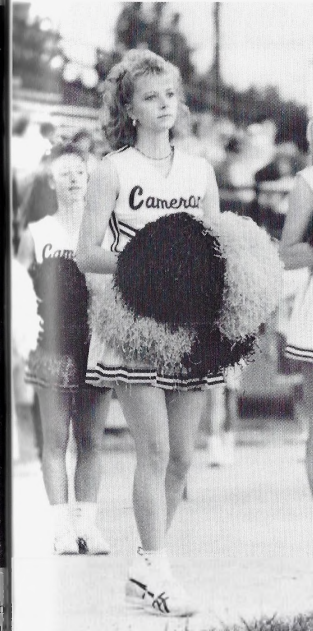

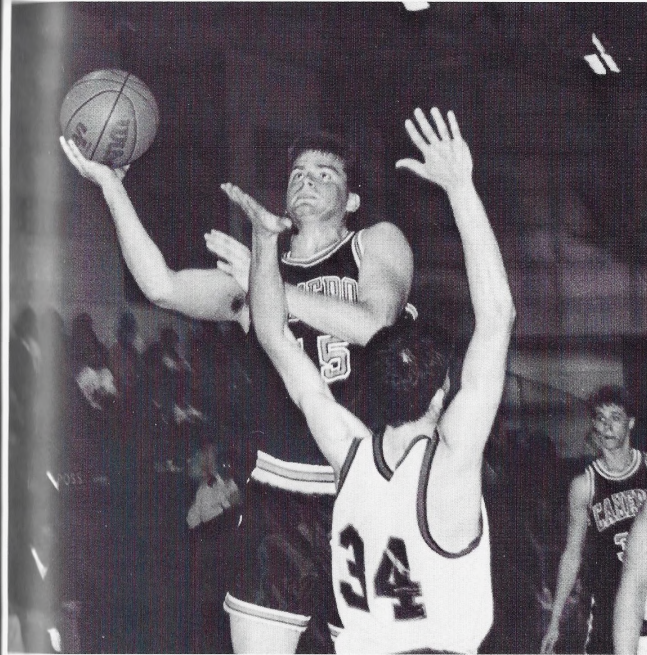
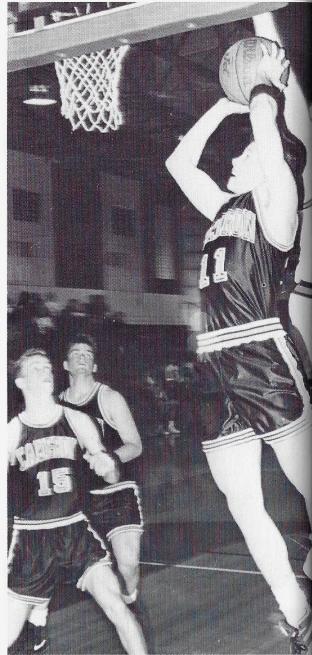
# A Fresh Start

playing won the Dragons three of the four regular season tournaments, including the conference tourney title. Following an early district tournament loss, team members began to prepare for next year.

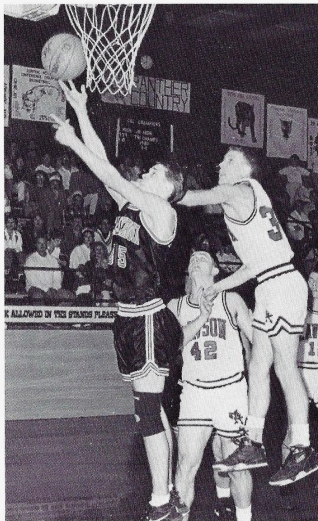

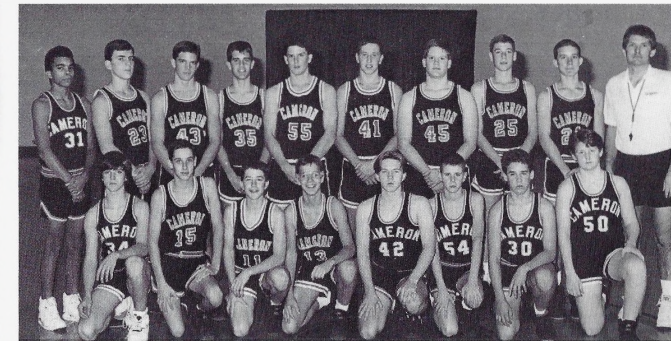

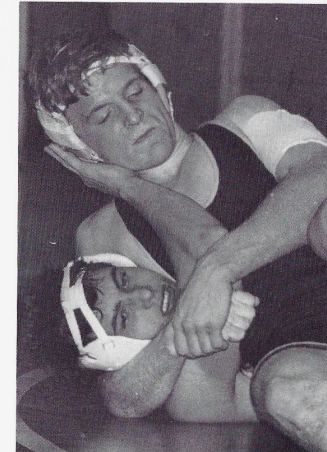

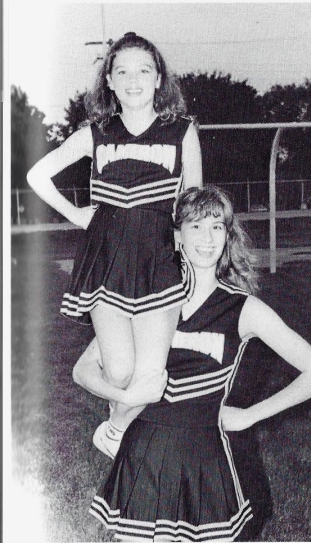
# We've got Spirit

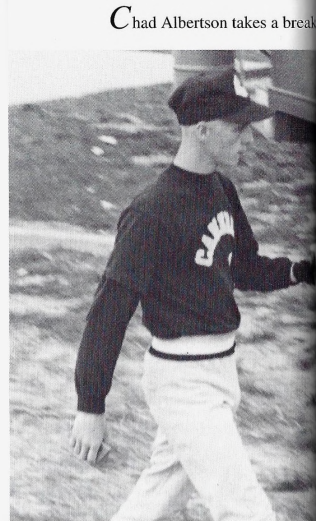

Mandy Livingston served as President for Region 2 and Chris Francisco was the Regional Male Representative.



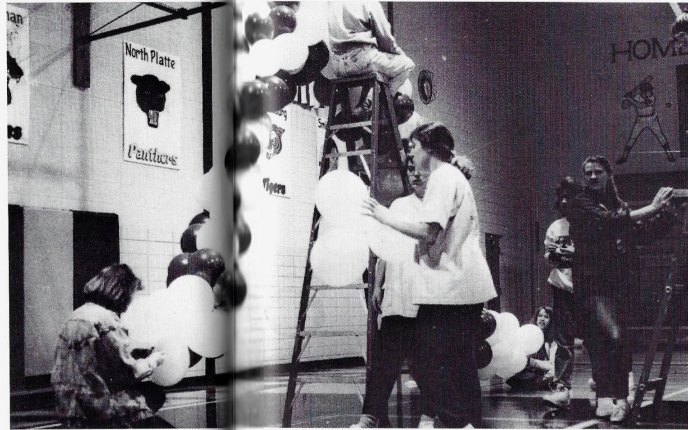

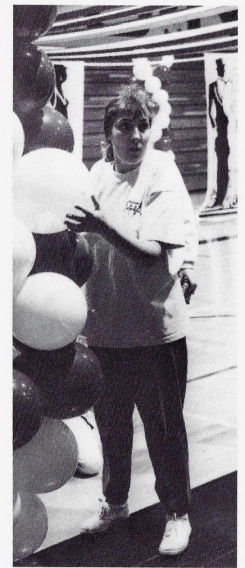

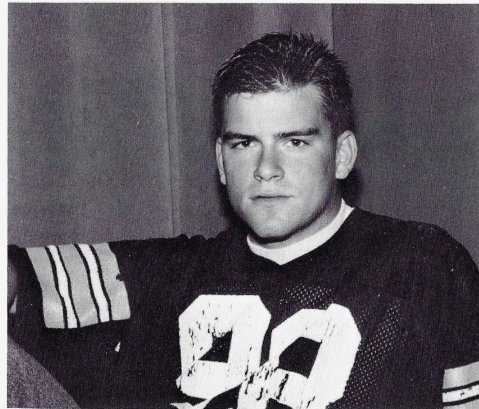
# Aiming for the Corporate Ladder

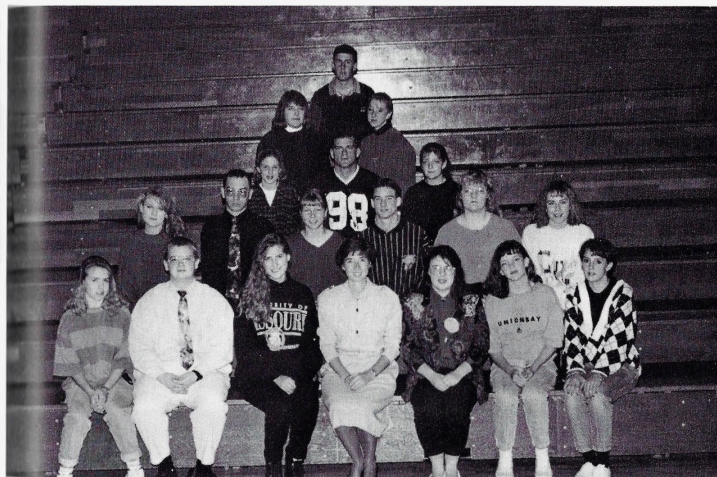

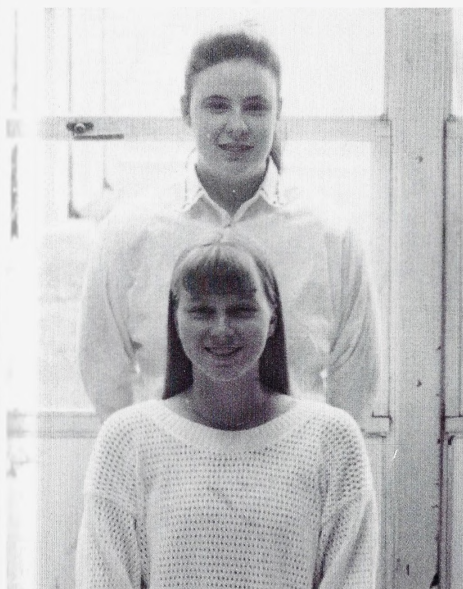

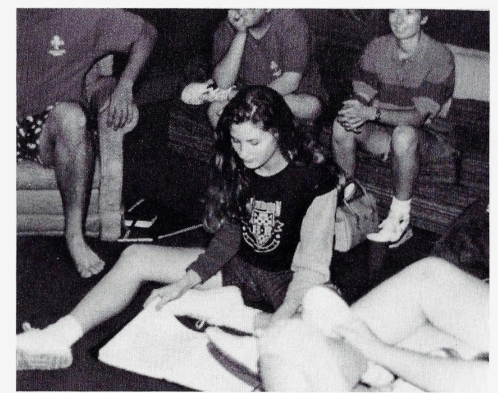

record 42 members, DECA had a highly profitable candy bar sales. As for district contest, DECA had quite a number of members who placed and a rela-

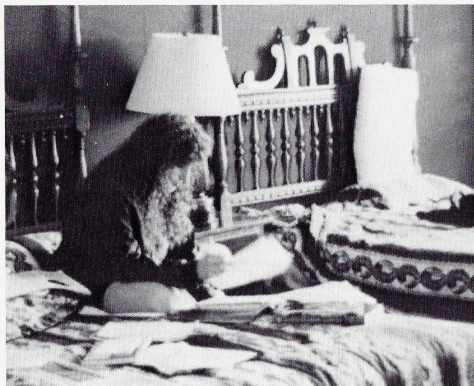

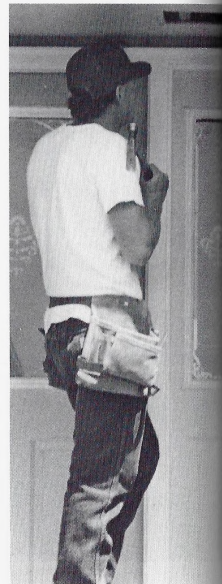

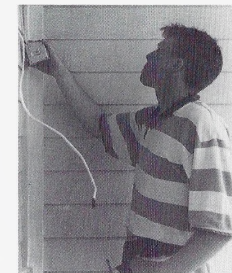

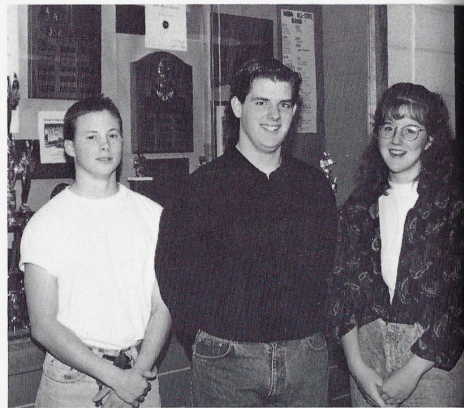

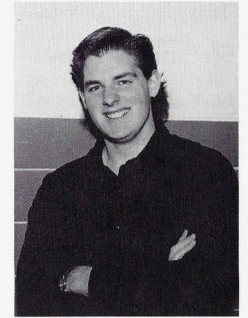

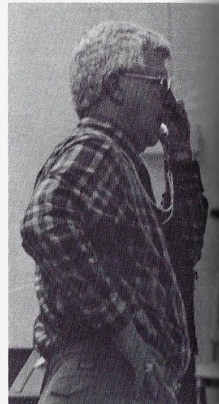

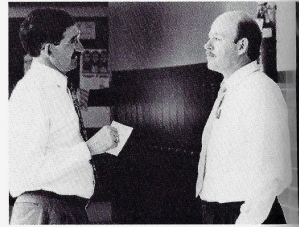

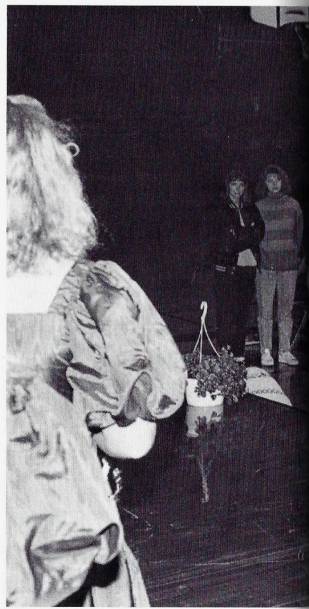

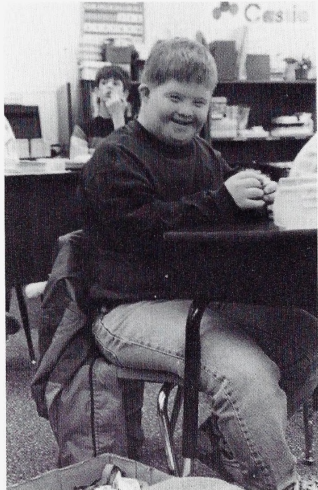
## Special services.

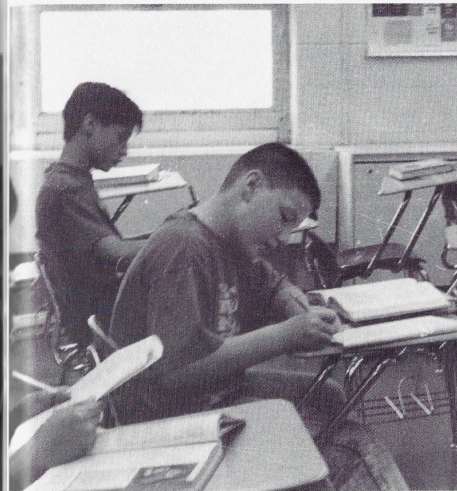
# Class of 1997
