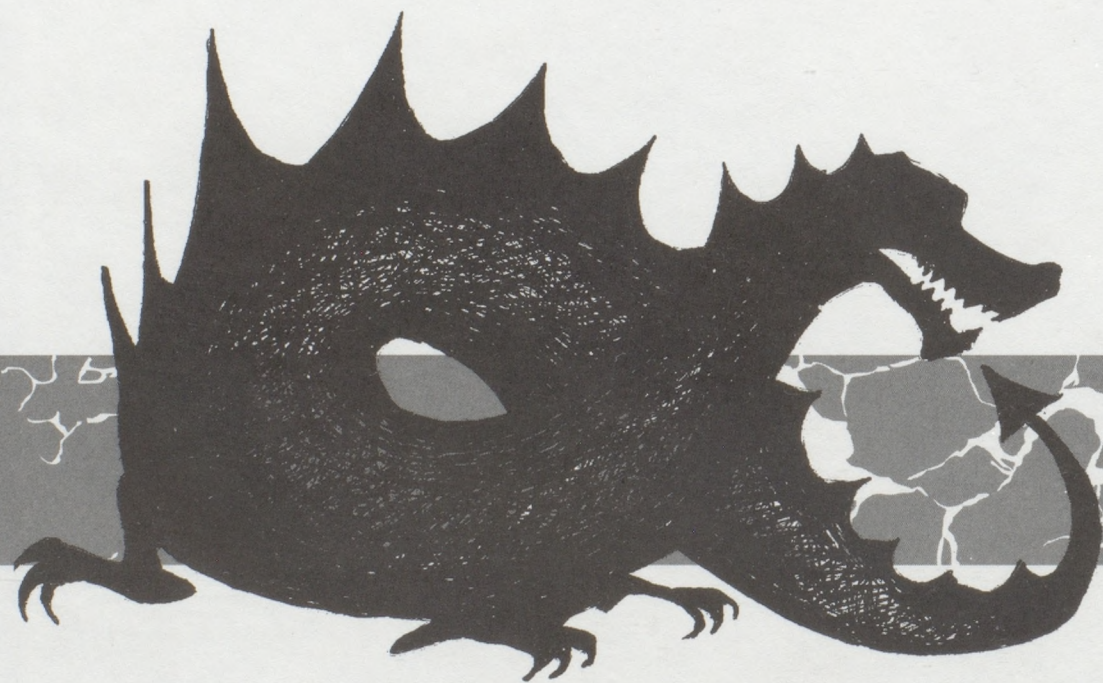

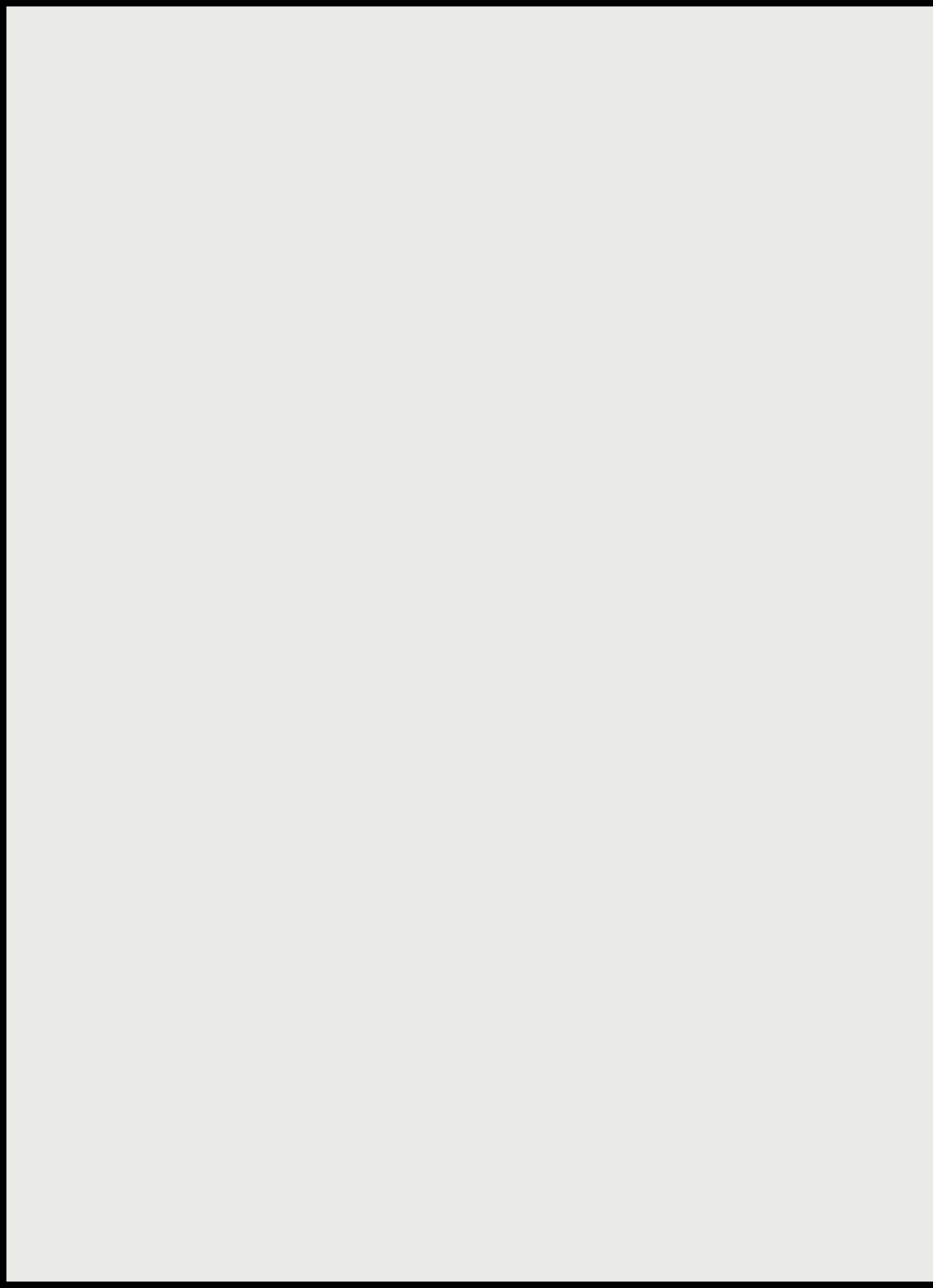

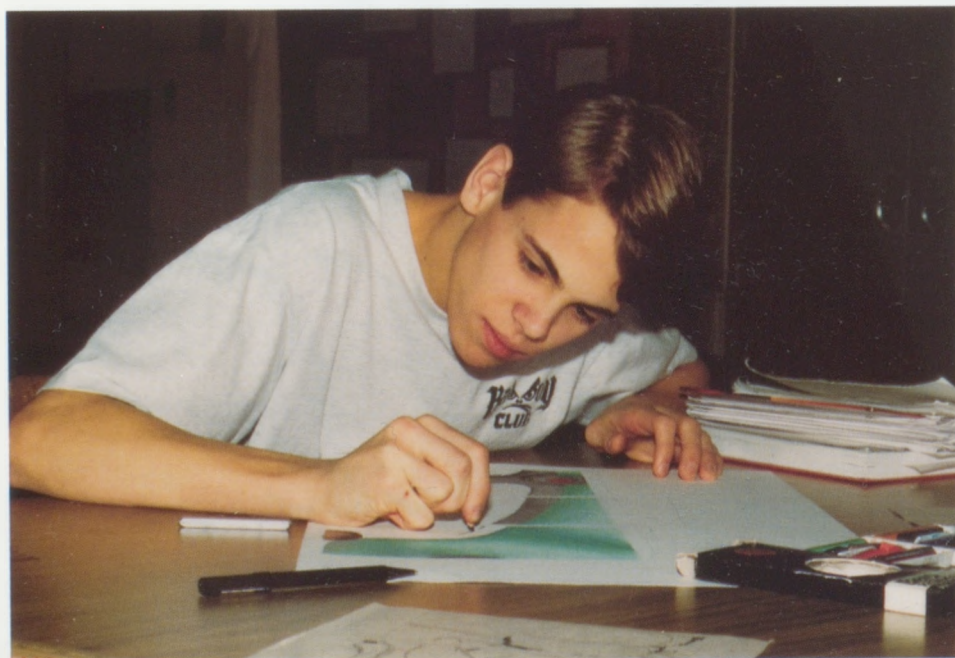
Another year full of memories has taken its course at CHS.

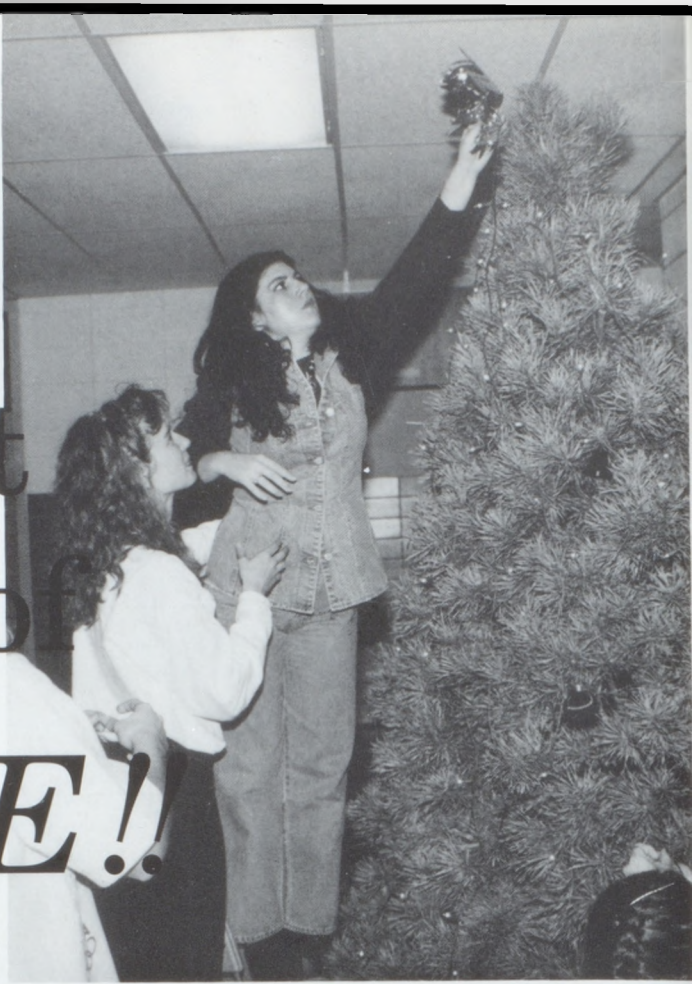

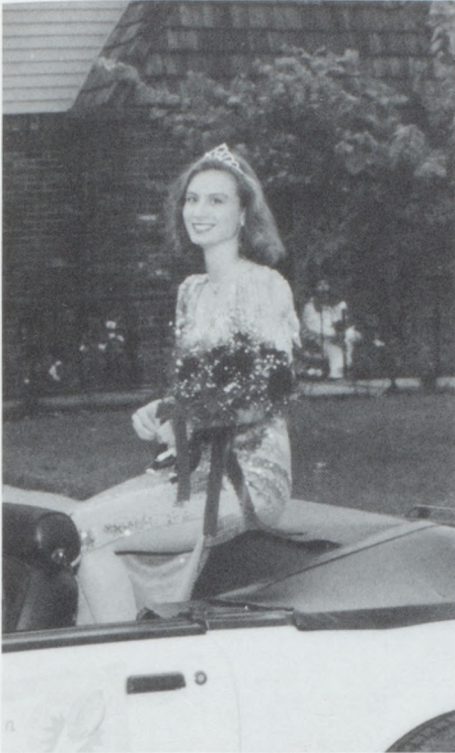

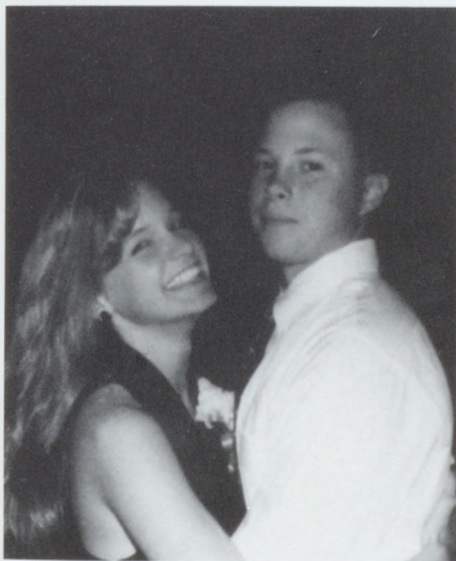

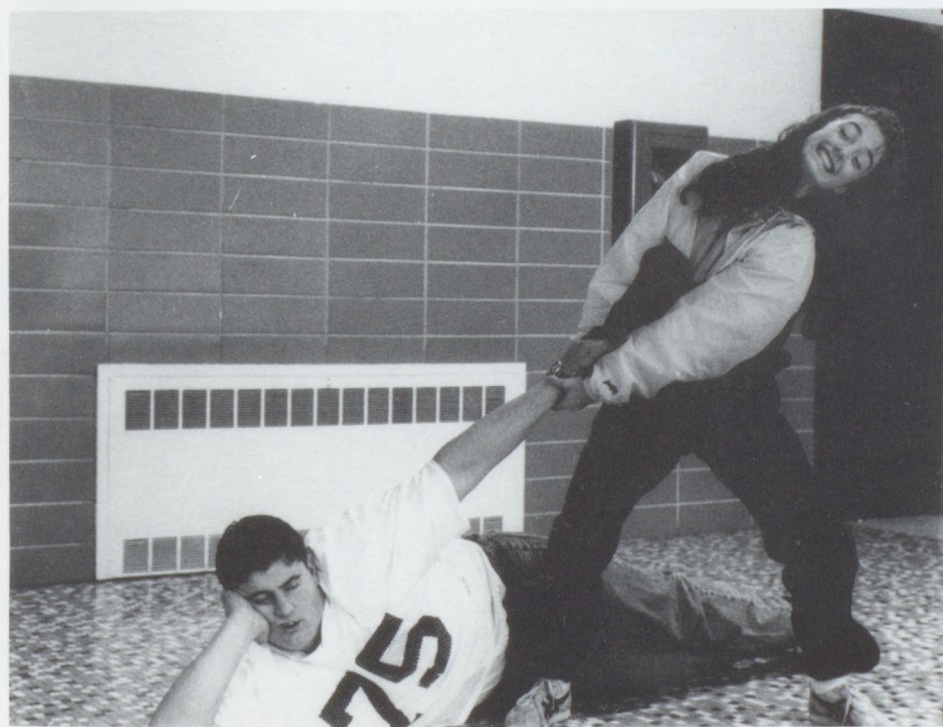

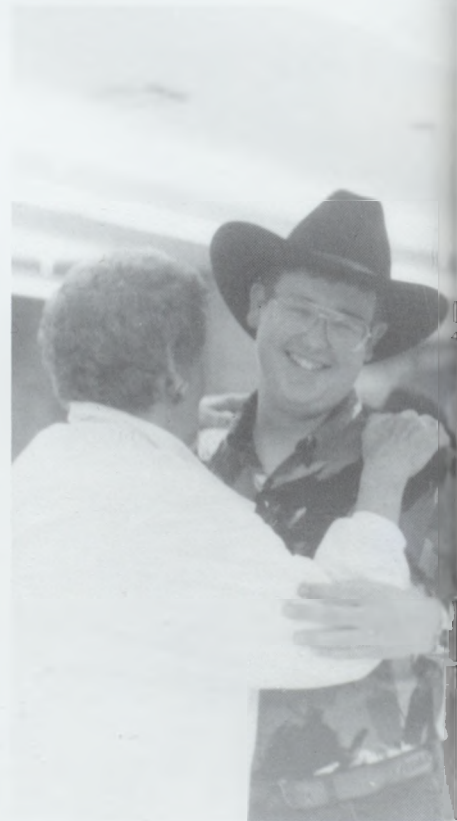
Everyone attending the dance enjoyed square dancing, line dancing and visiting

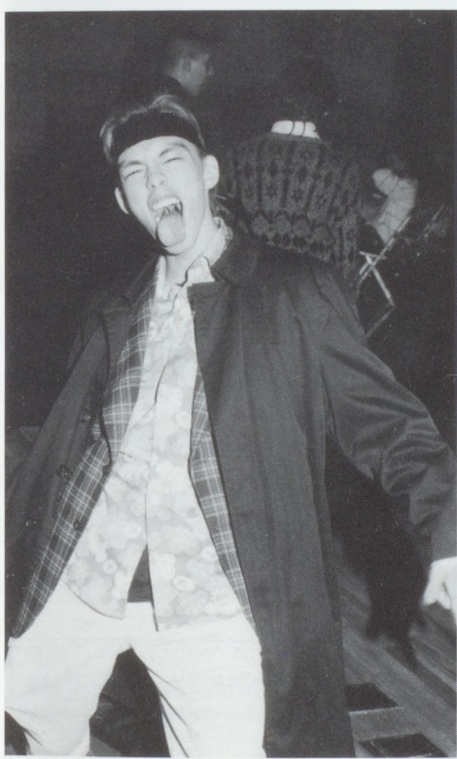

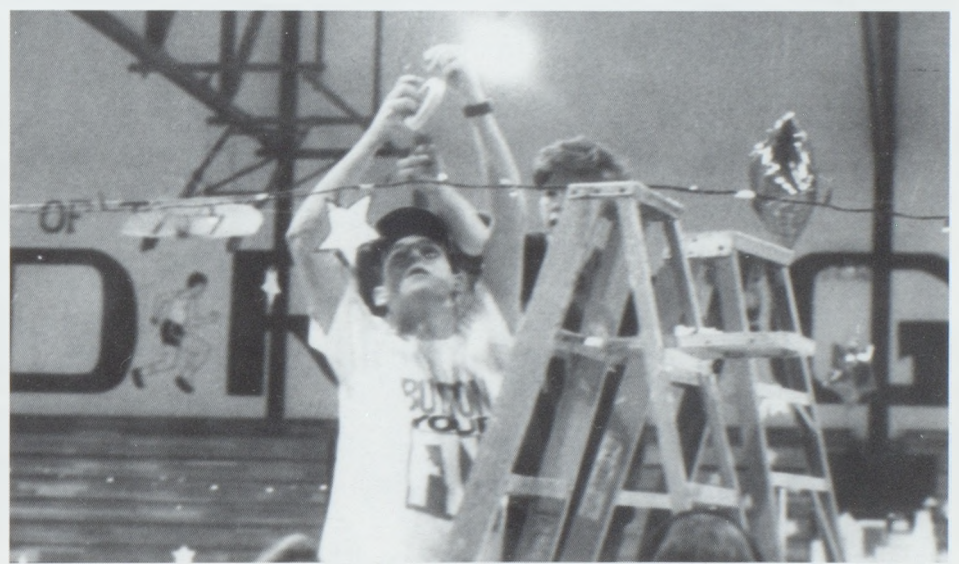

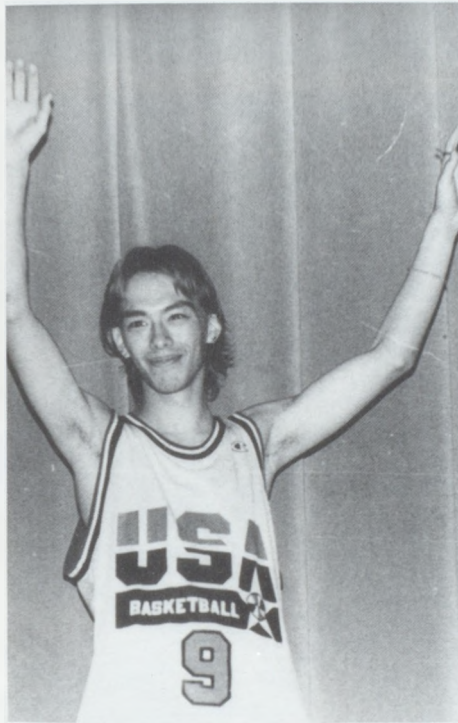

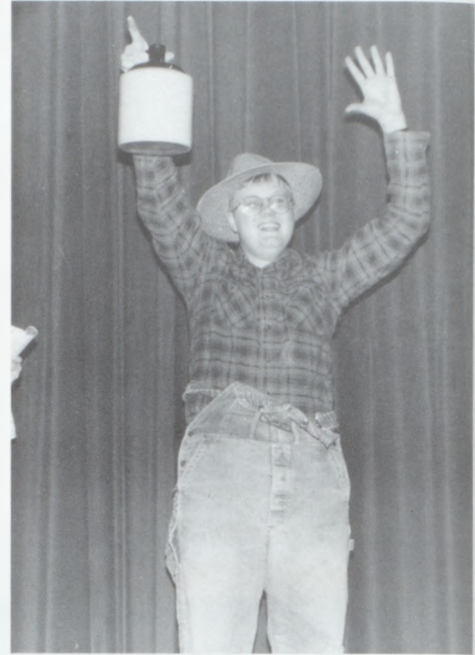

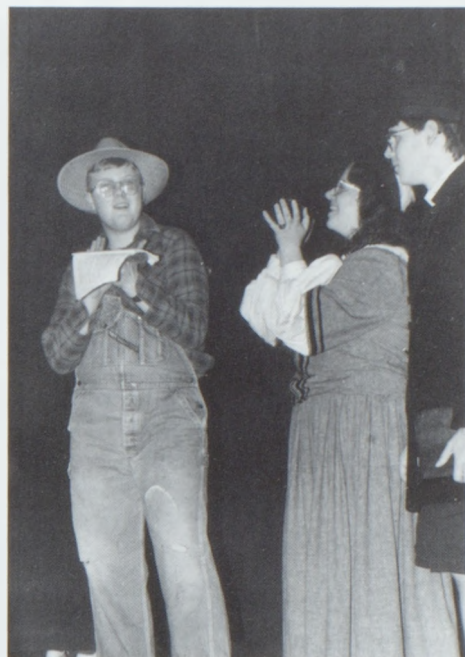

Can I use the phone to check out please?"

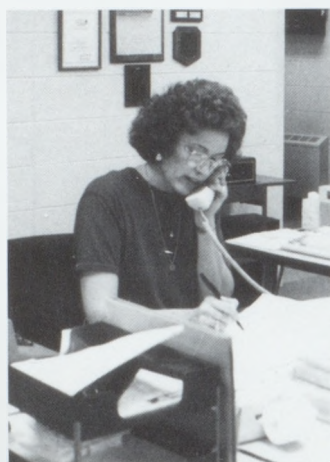

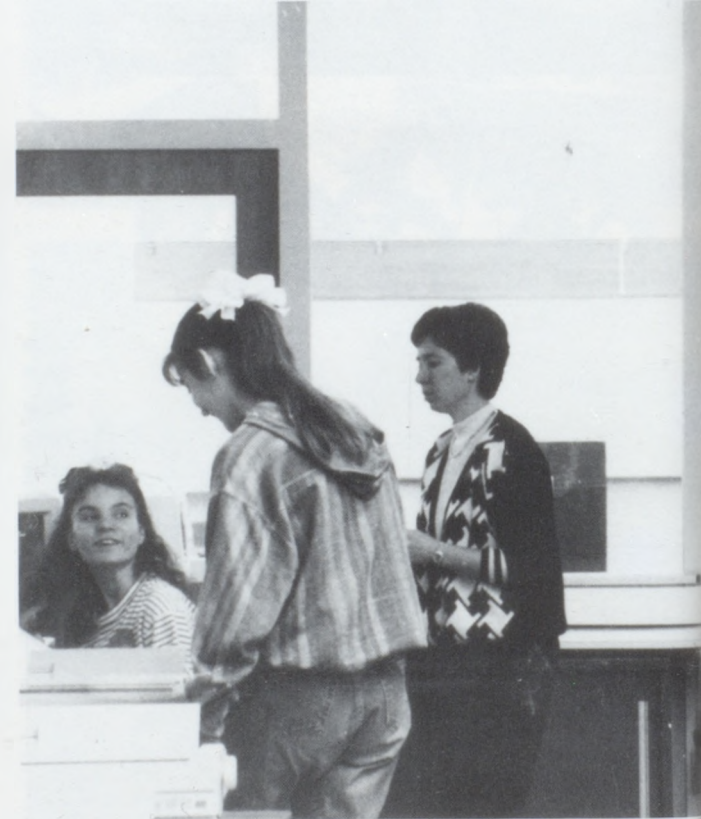

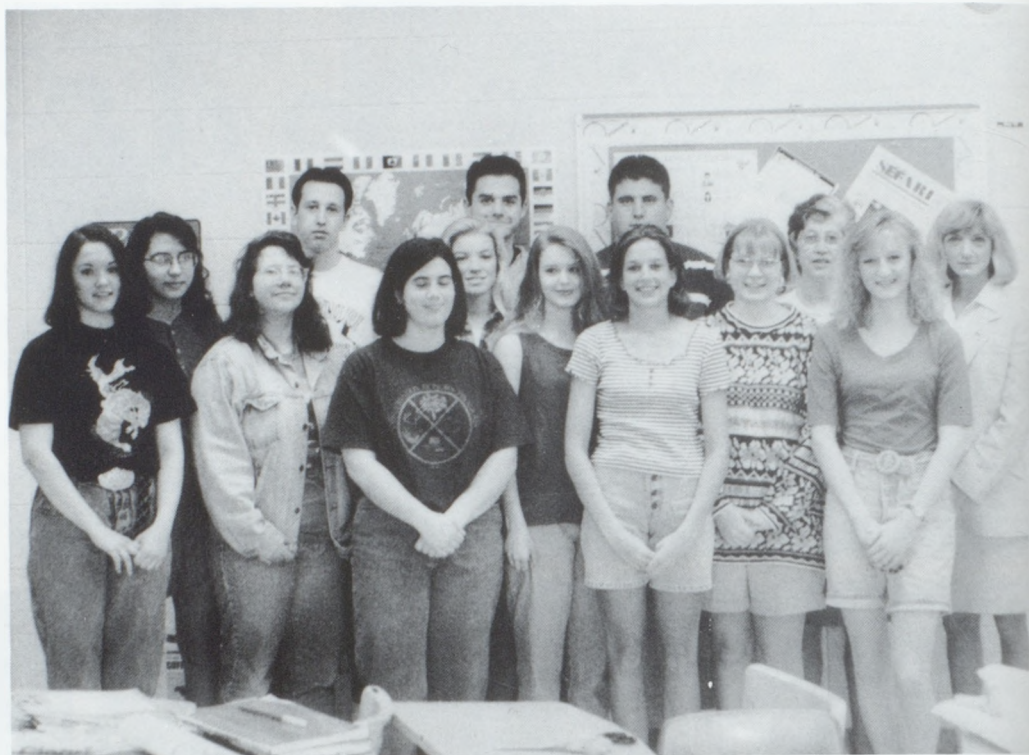


# Foreign Language

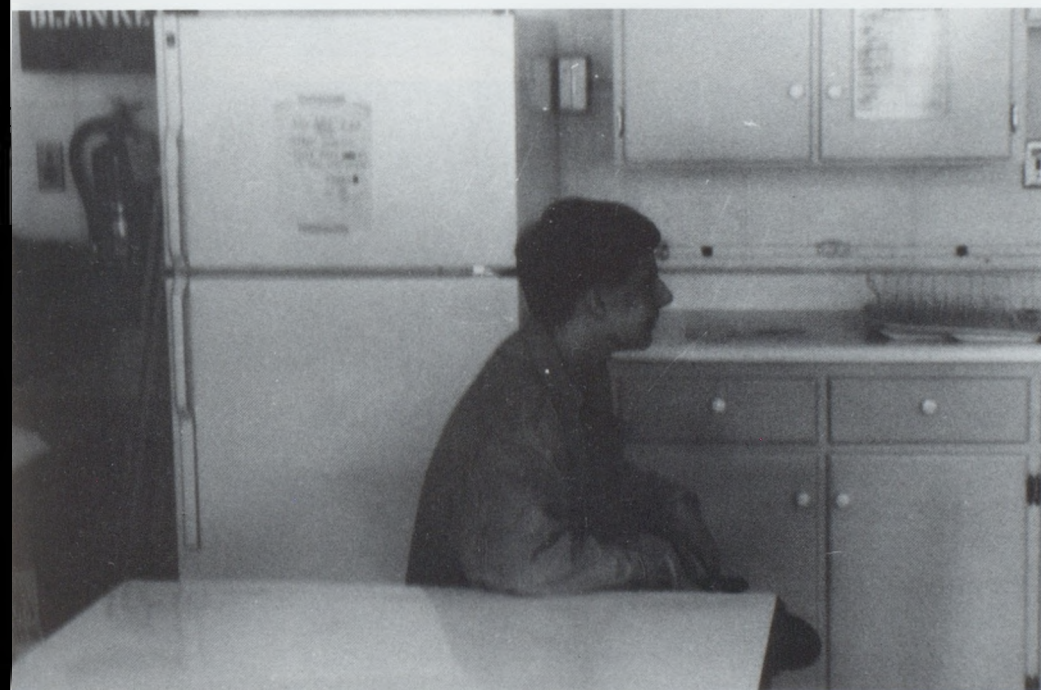

tion ceremonies.

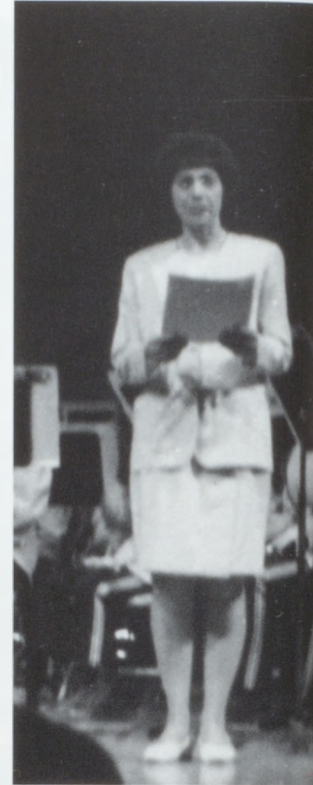

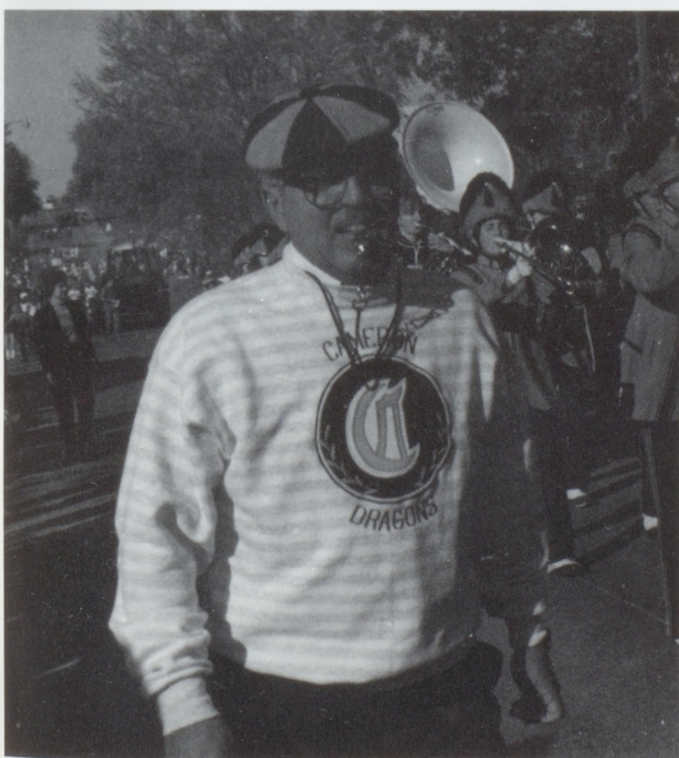

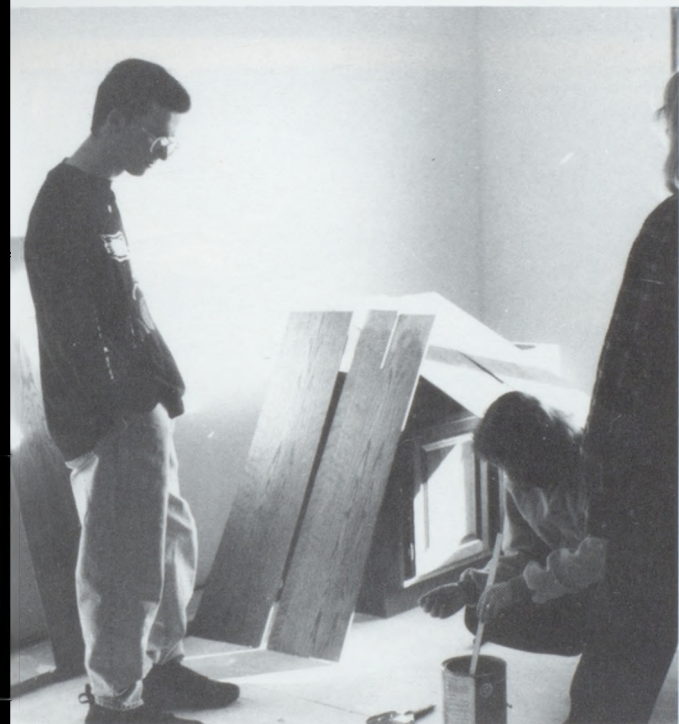

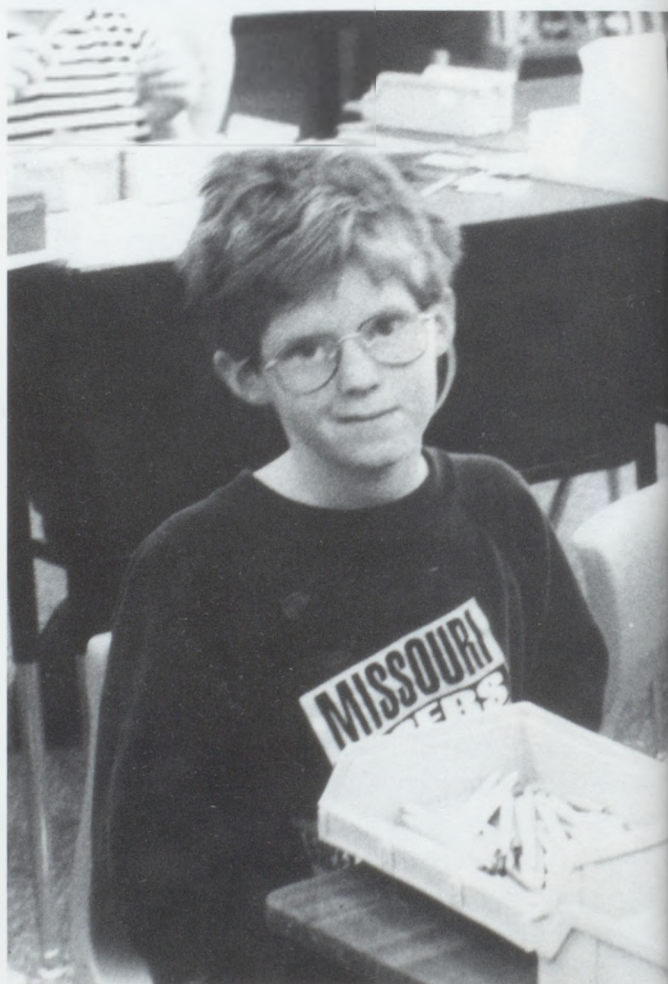
timed in the classroom. Some students have the opportunity to work in local businesses around town.

There is also the buddy system where a non-handicapped student peer will take a handicapped student peer into the regular class.



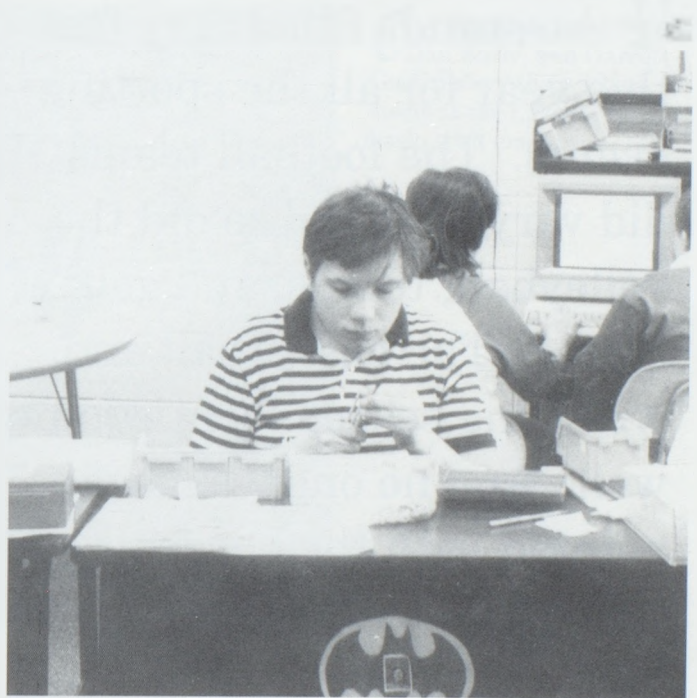

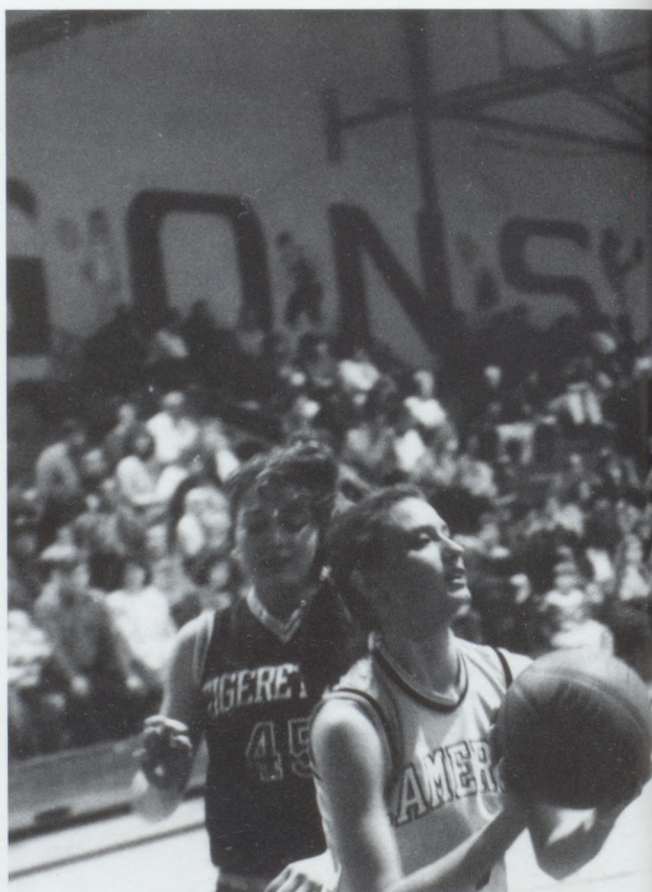

# Adversity doesn't stop the Dragons

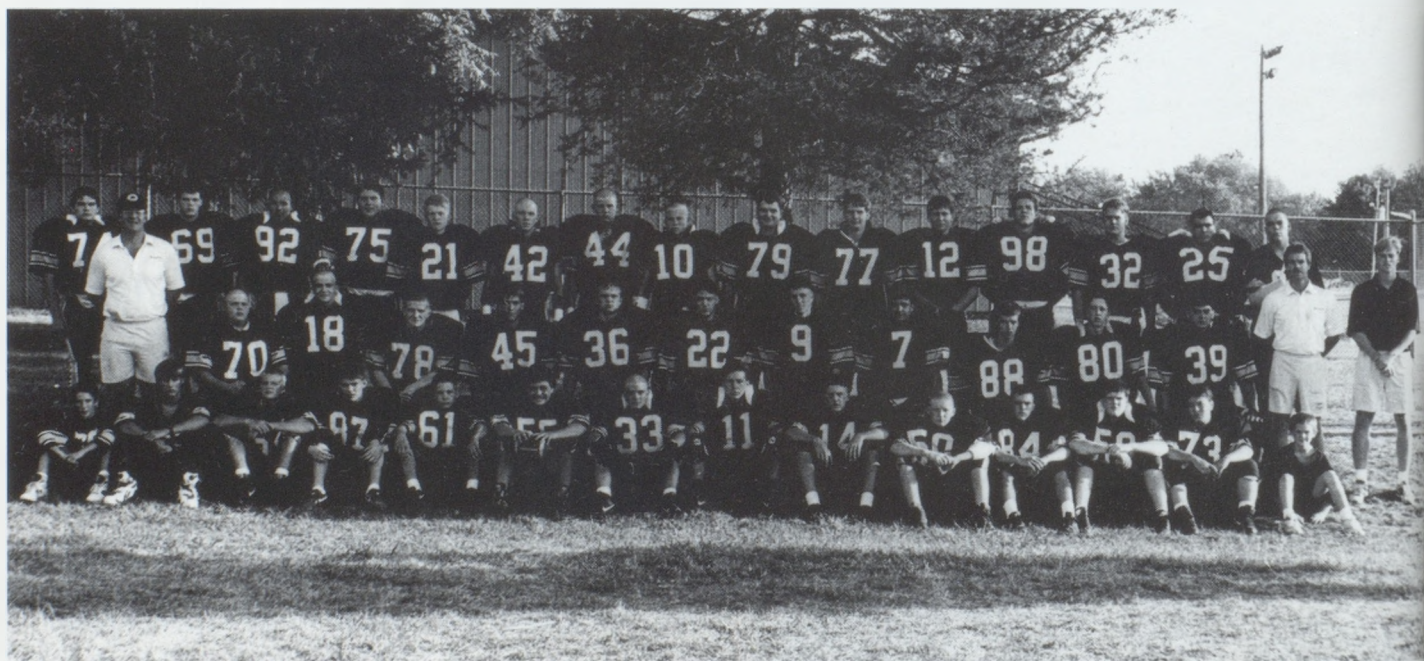

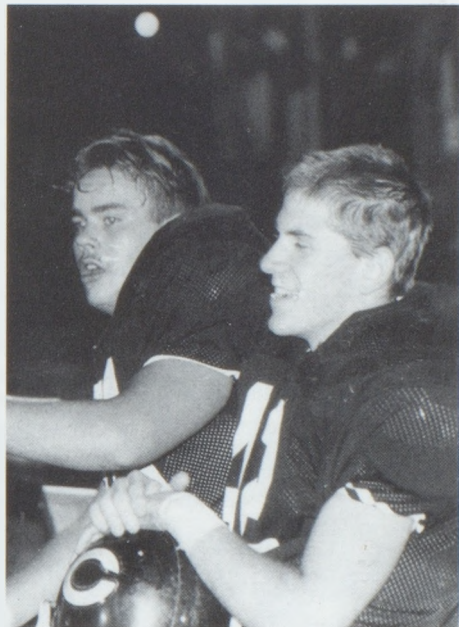

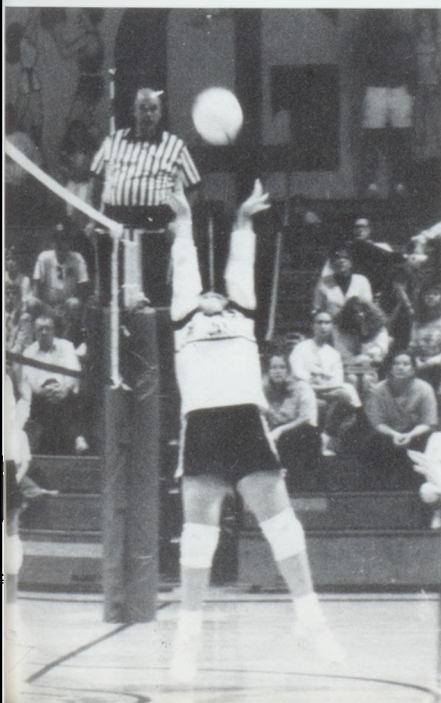

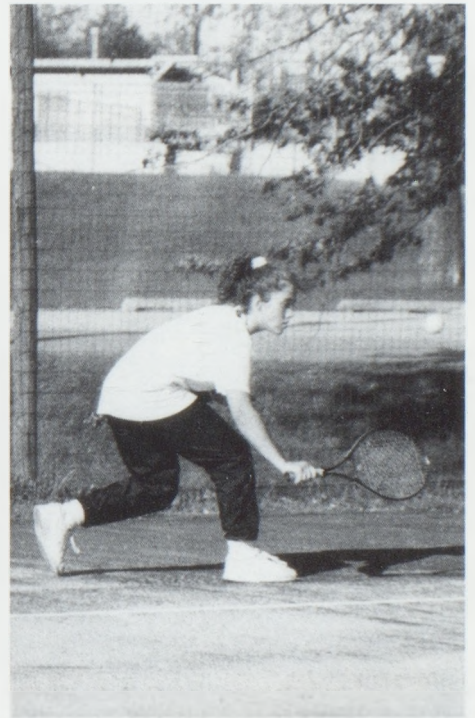

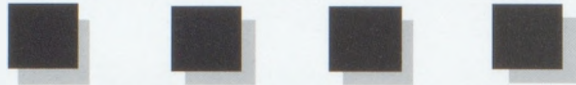

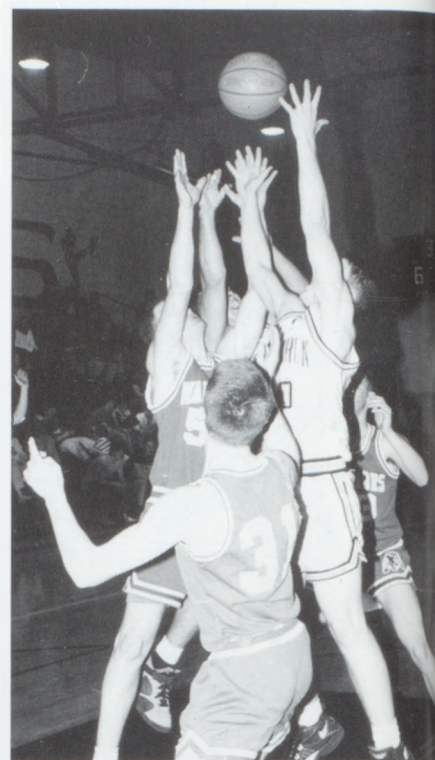
# Varsity Basketball Shoots for Victory

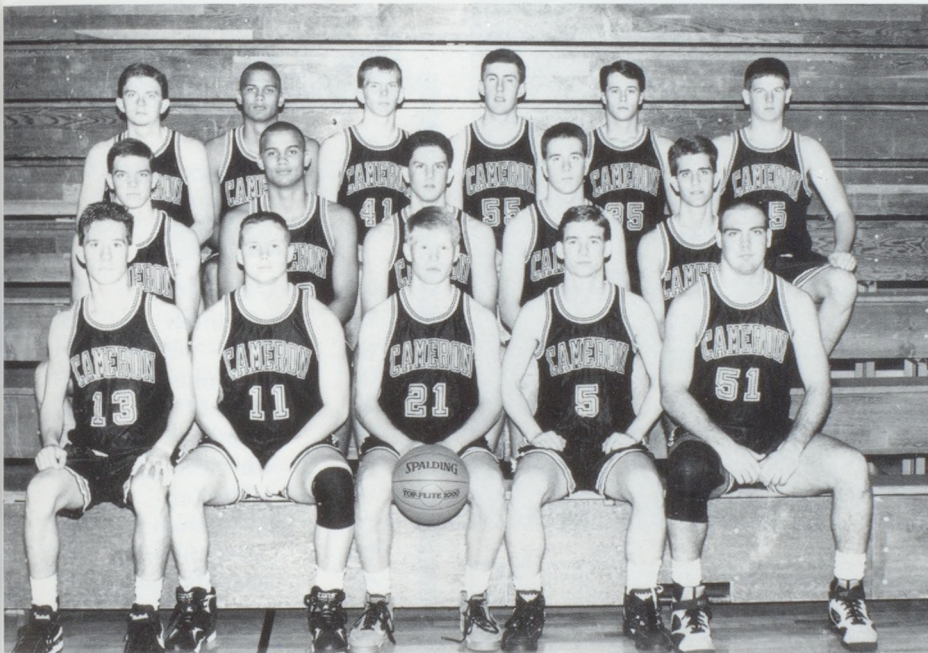

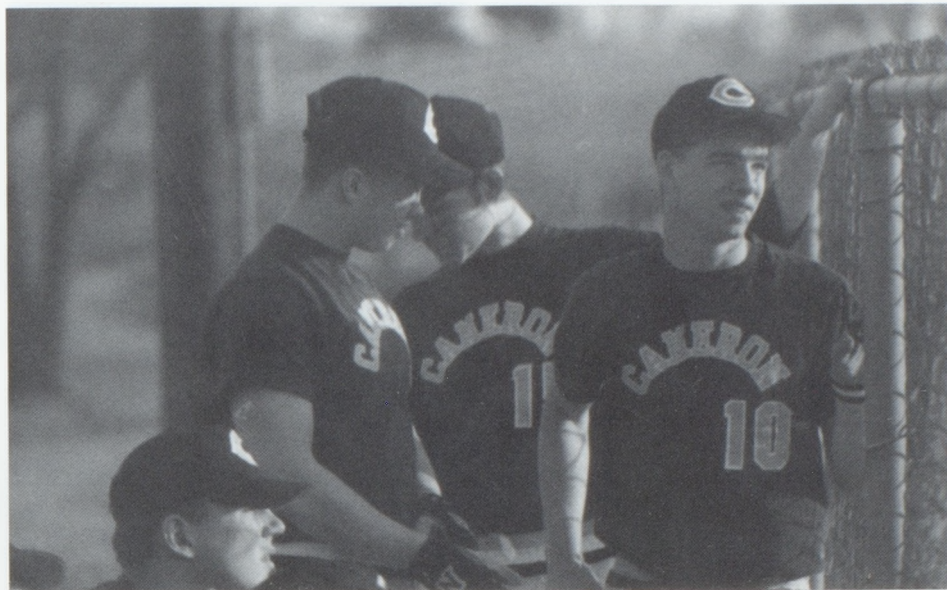

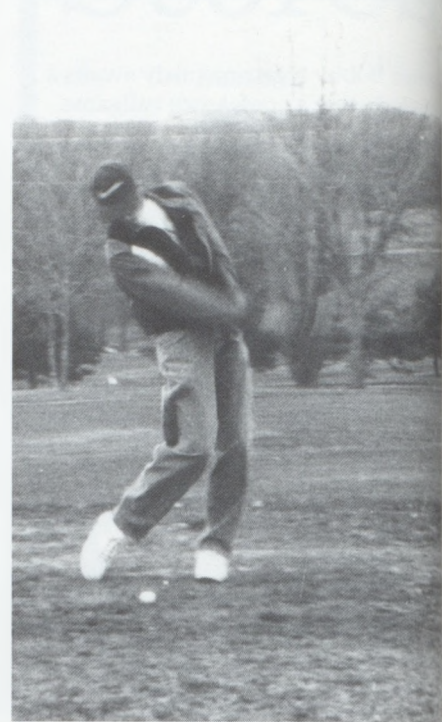

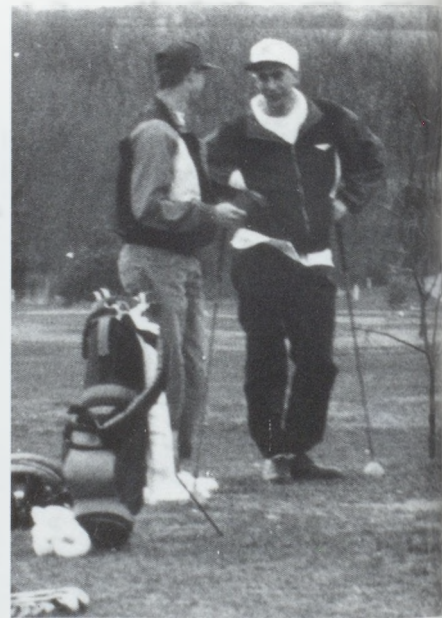


Sean Berry concentrates on sinking the putt for a birdie.

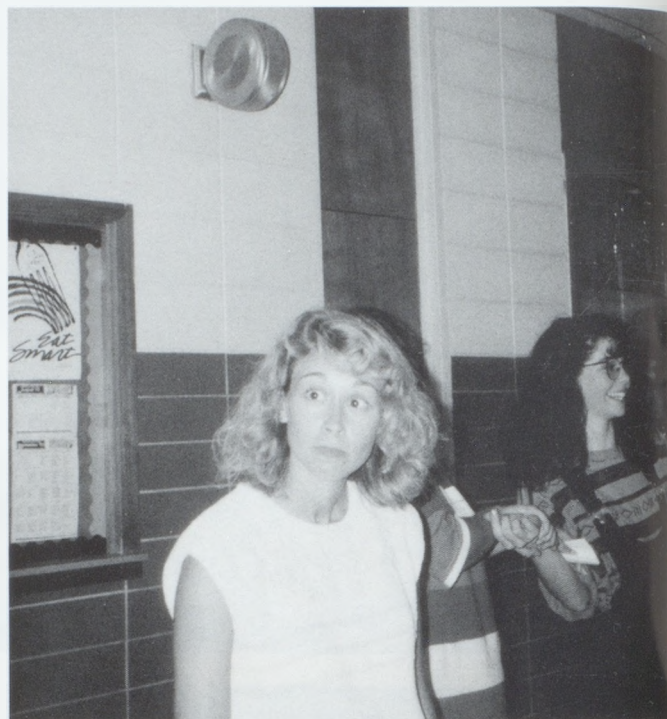
The fall months for the Future Homemakers of America begins their year with regional meeting held at Missouri Western State College. This year's guest speaker was Al Porter.

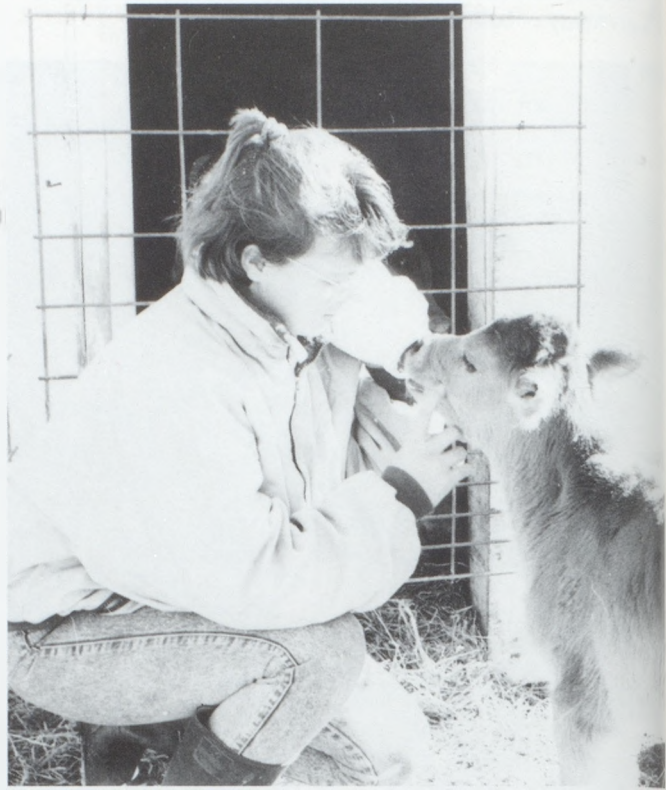

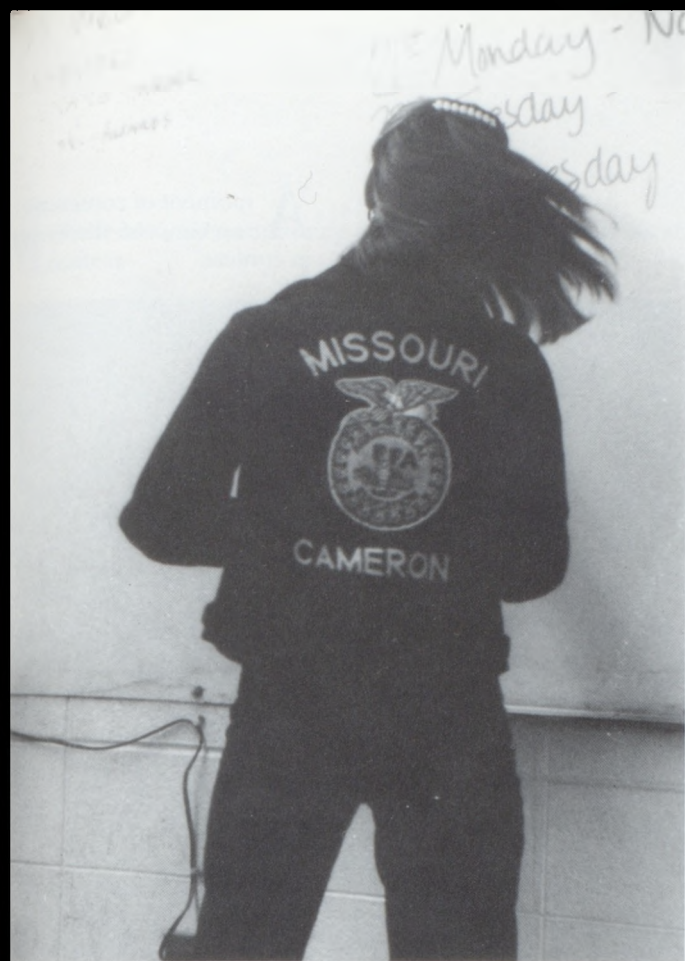

In the spring, a bowl-a-thon to support MDA was organized, raising close to \$700.



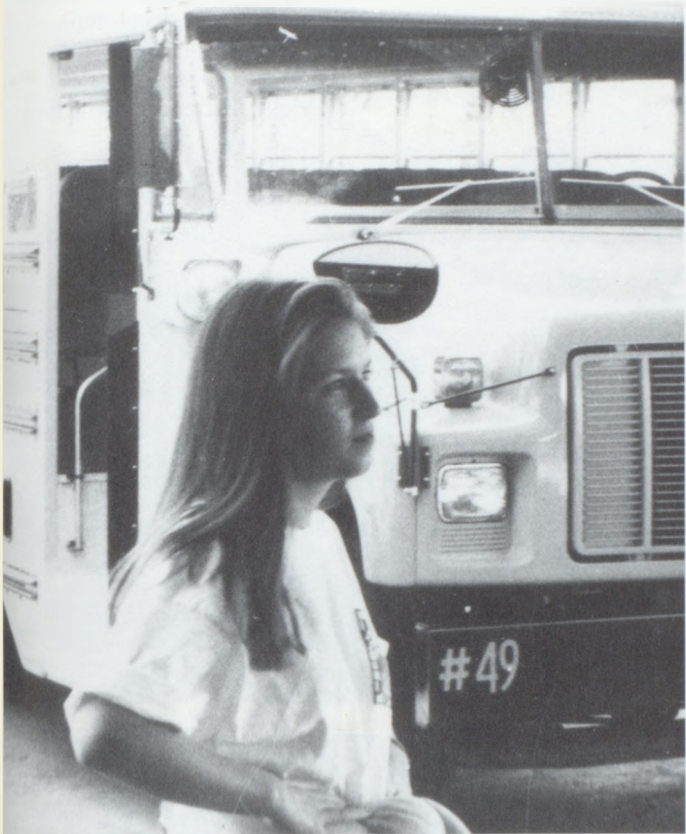

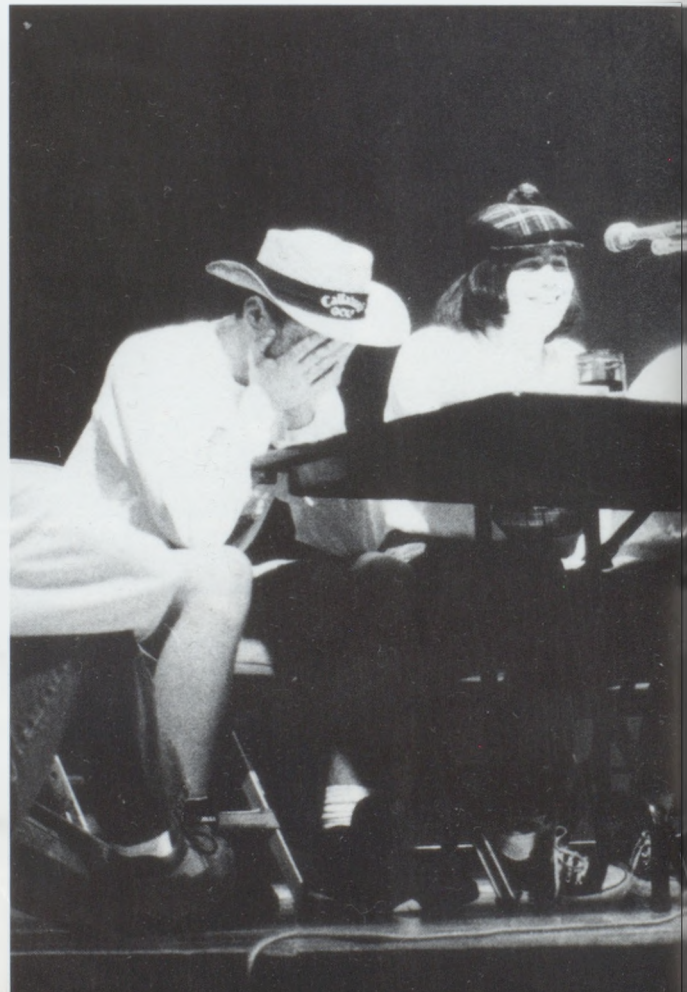

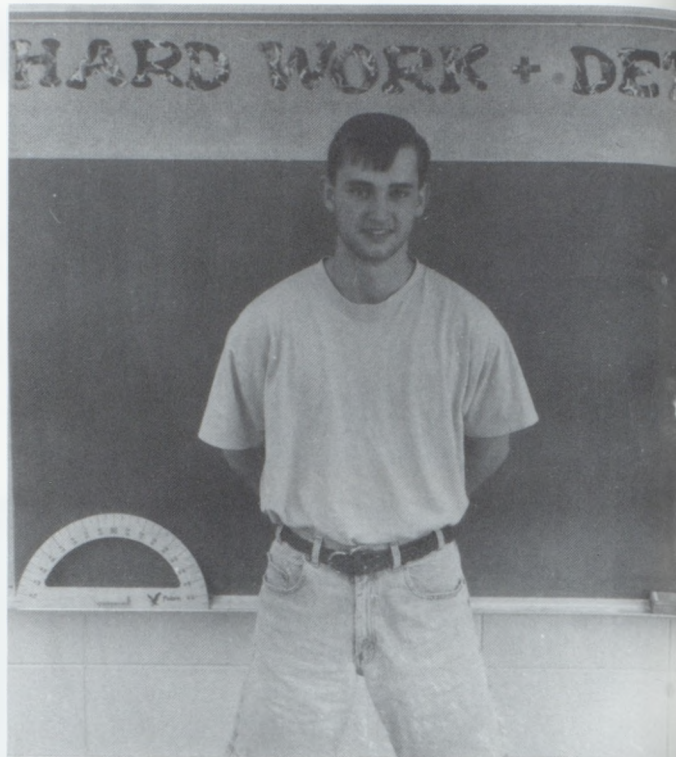


# Talent

In the band department of our school, there were two quartet's, two solo's and one ensemble that attended district contest and also attended State Contest.

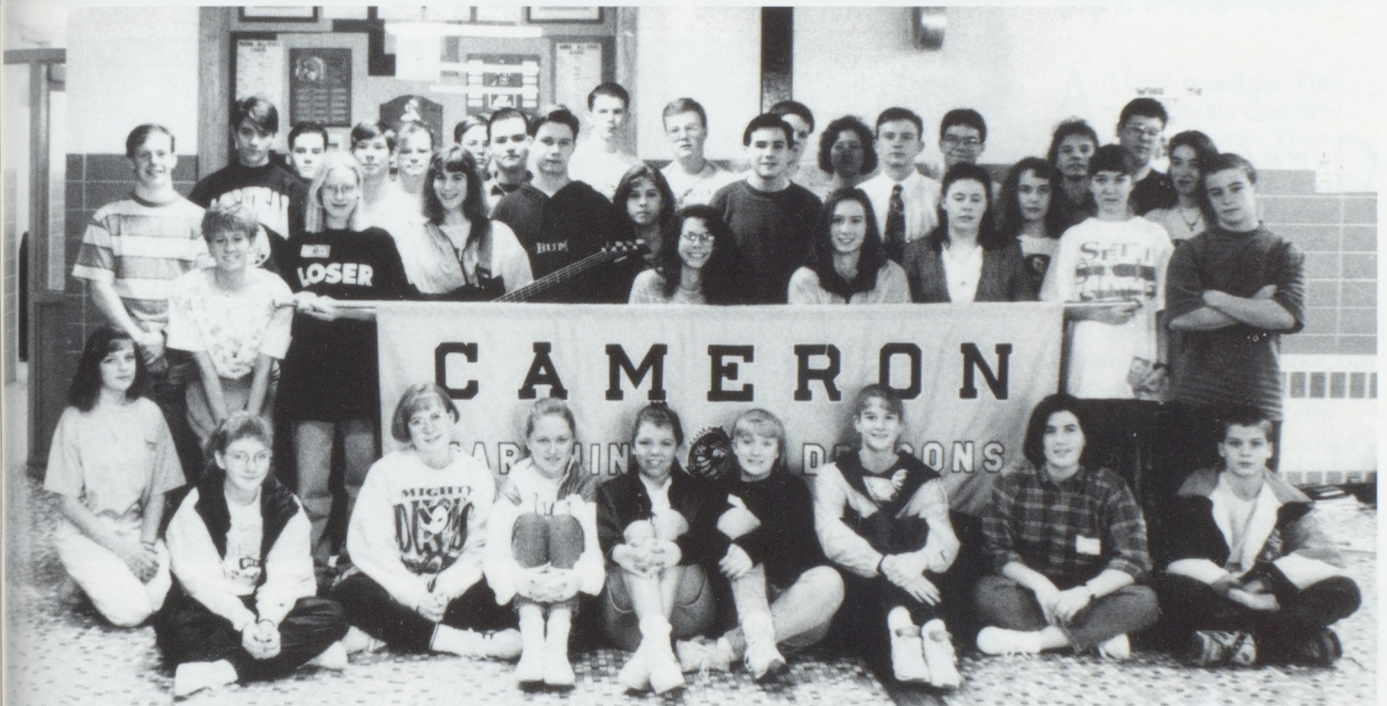
