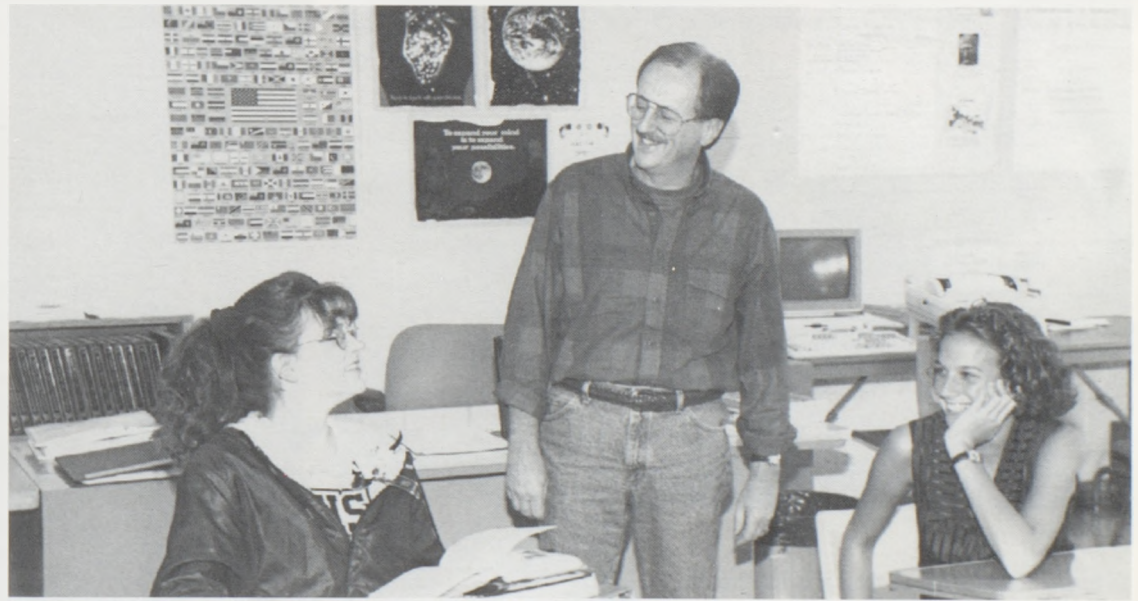

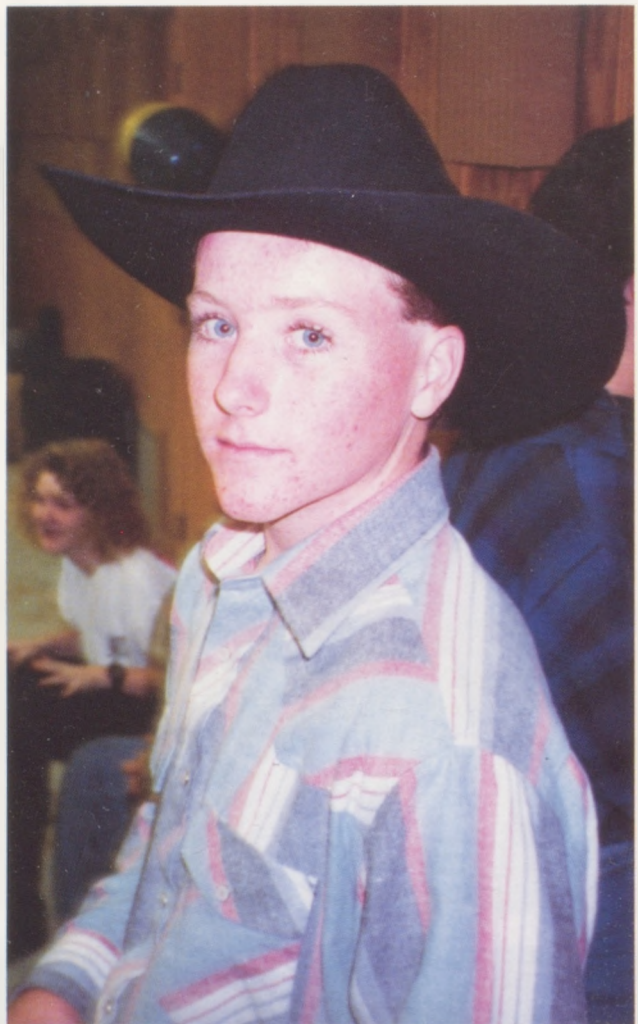

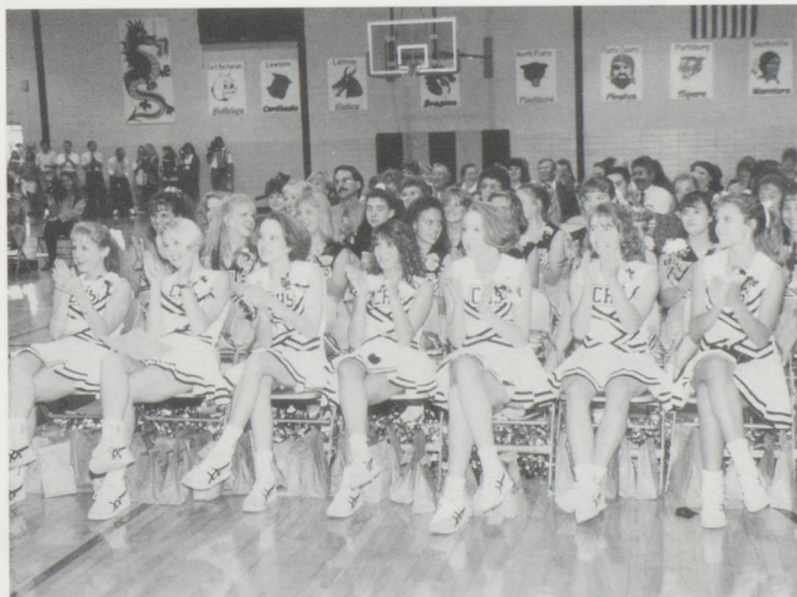

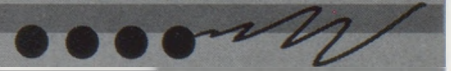

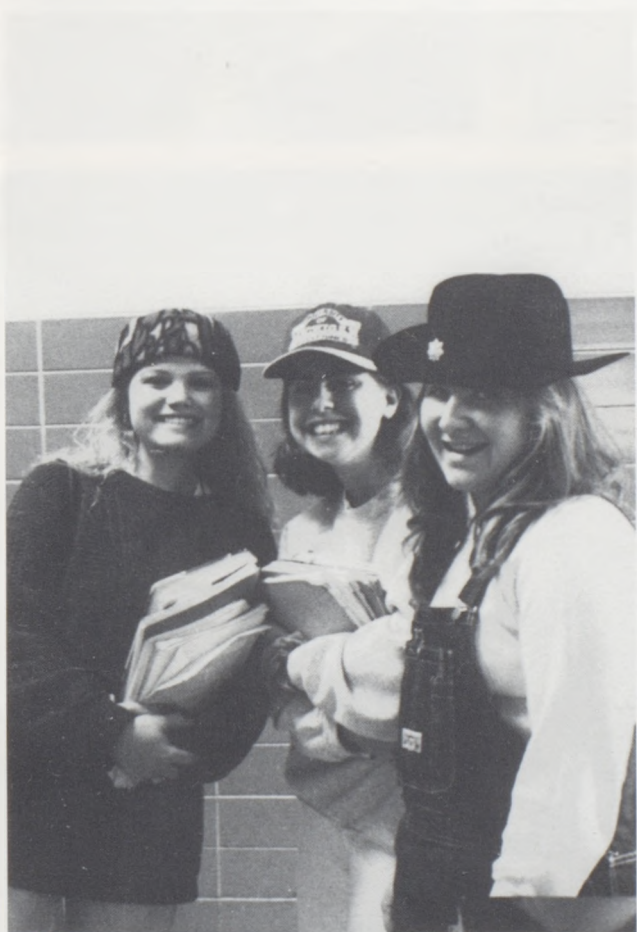

"It was the best prom that I had ever been associated with." said Mr. Heard.

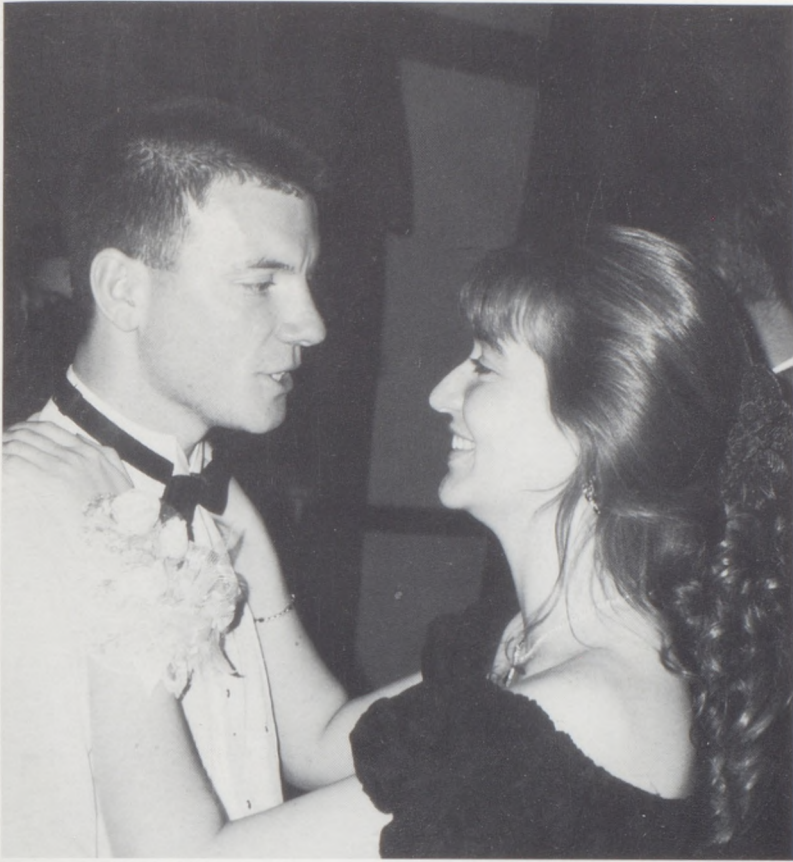

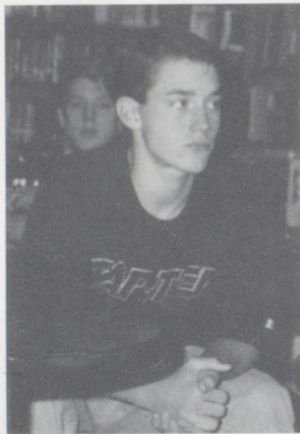
# Look At What We're Getting Into

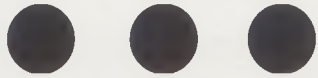

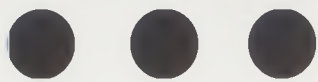

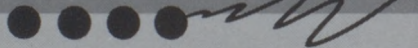

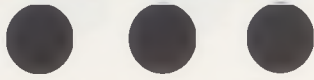

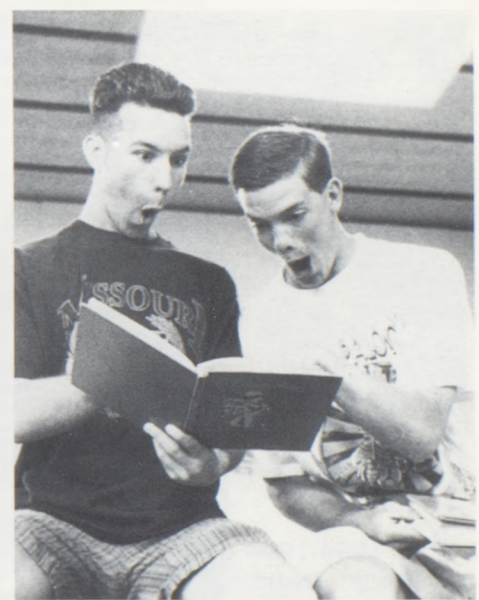

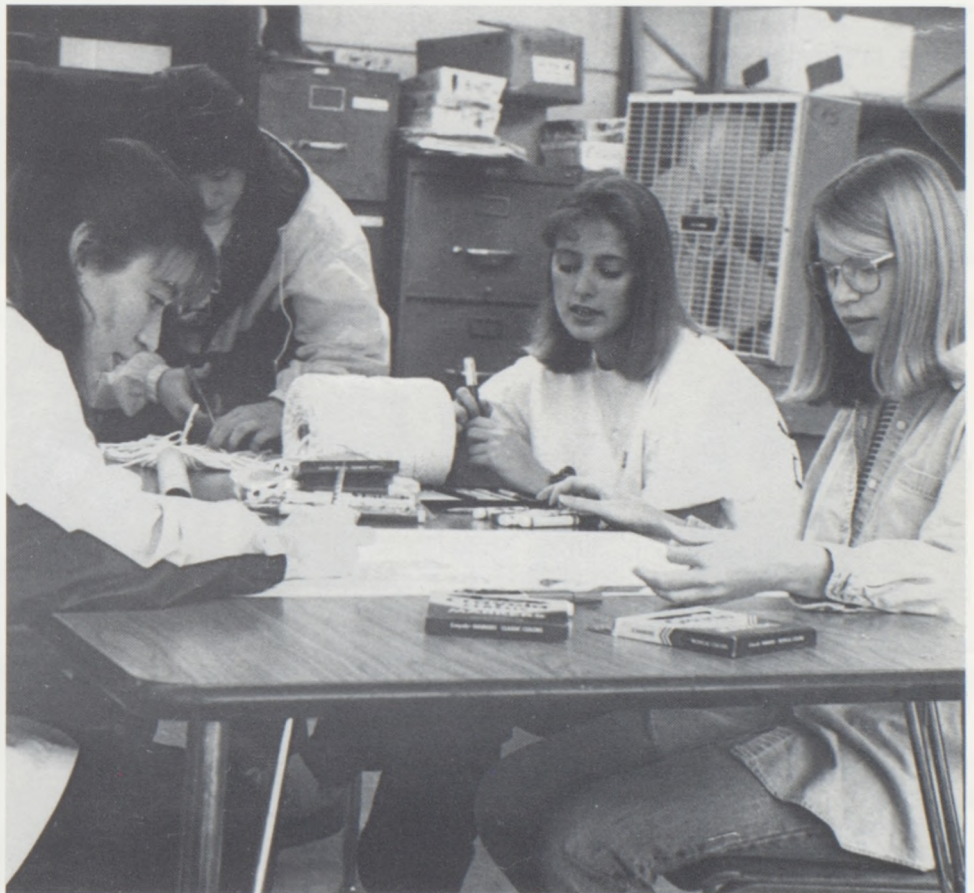

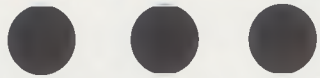

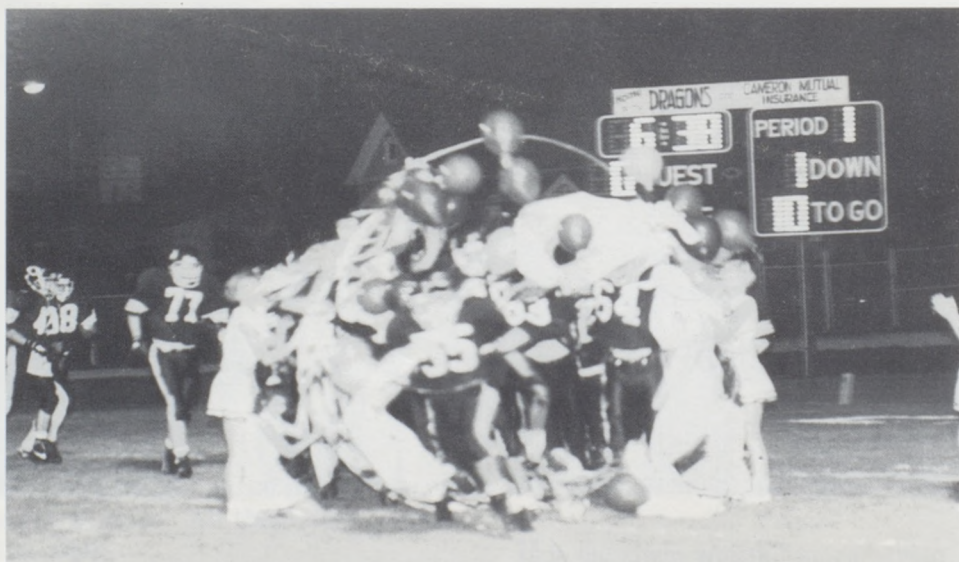

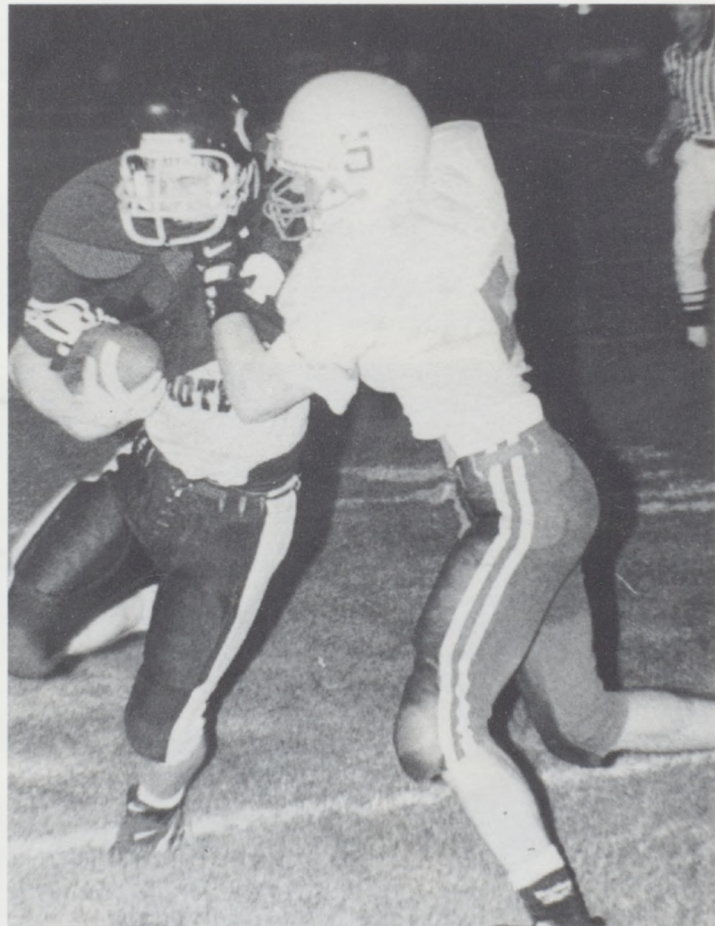

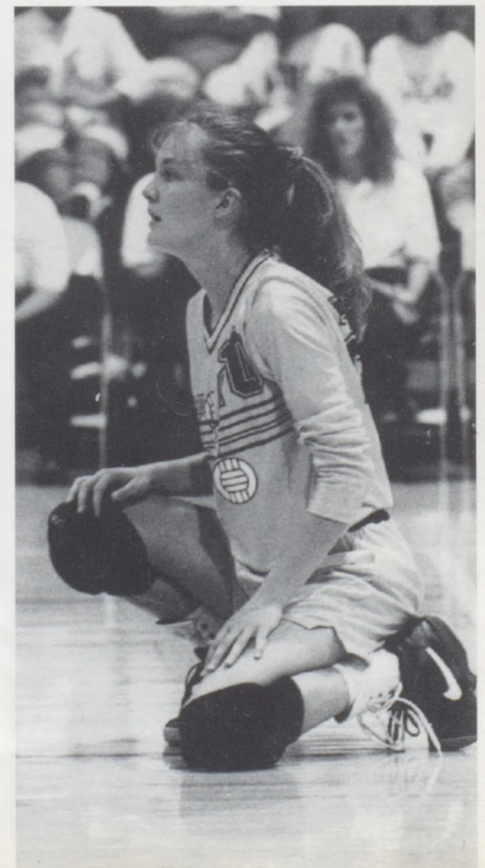

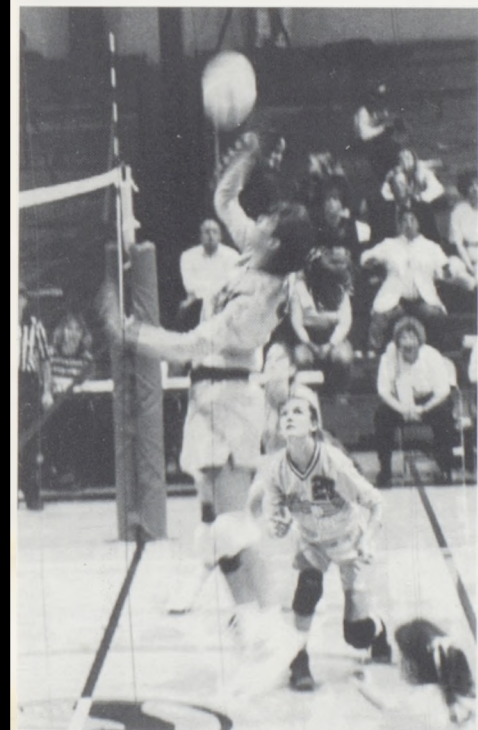

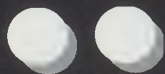

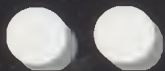

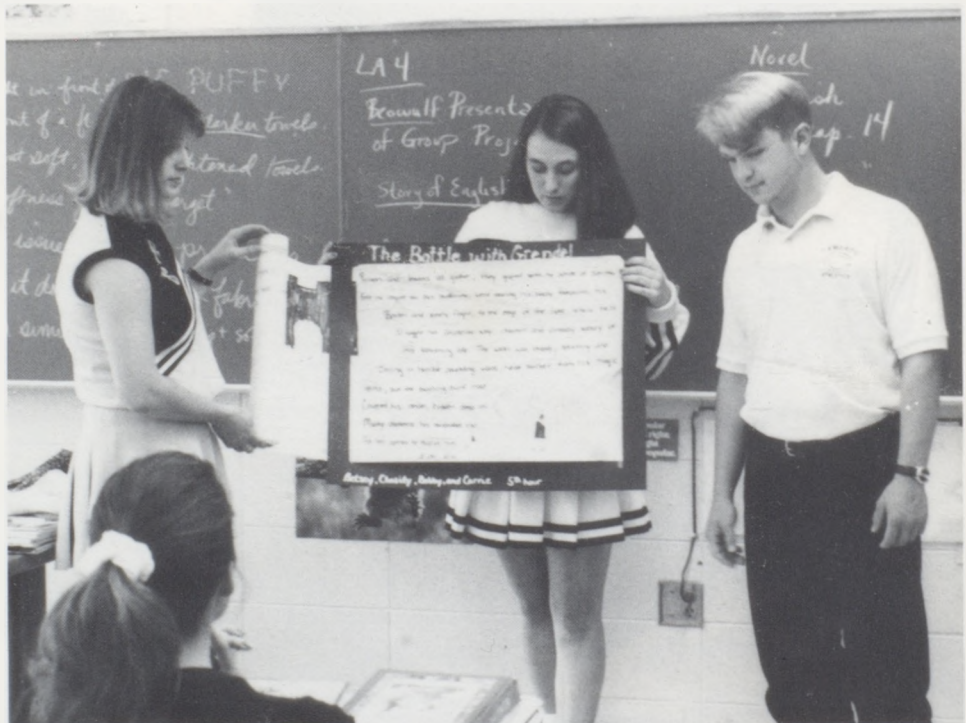

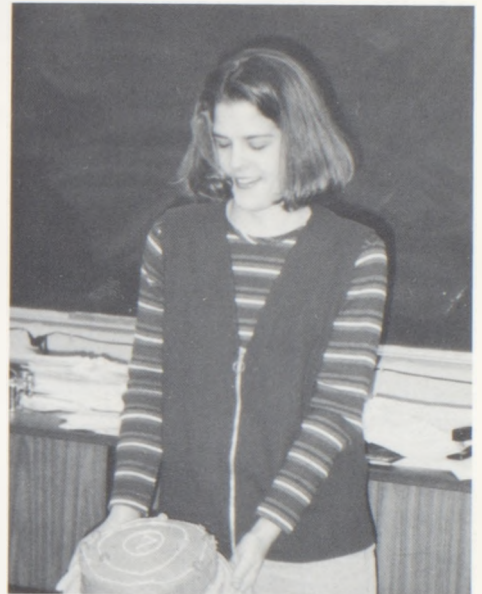

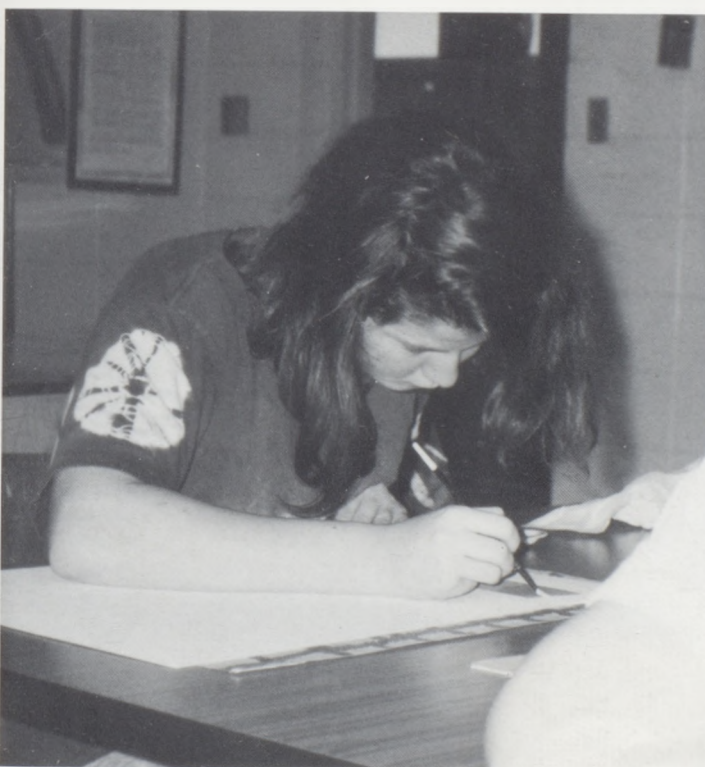

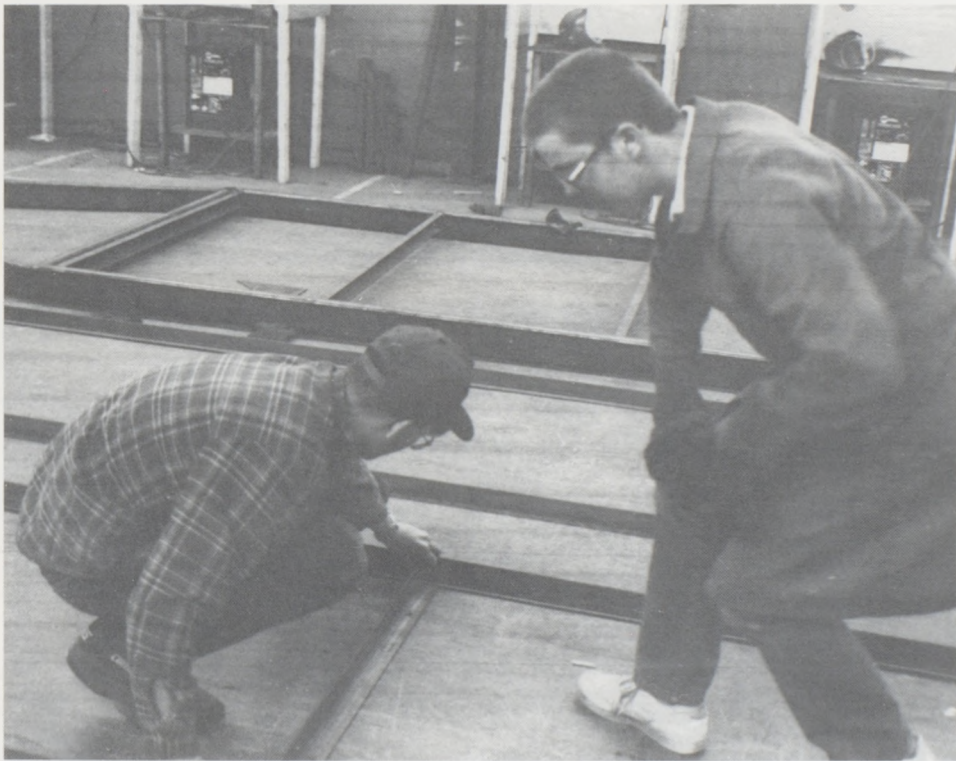

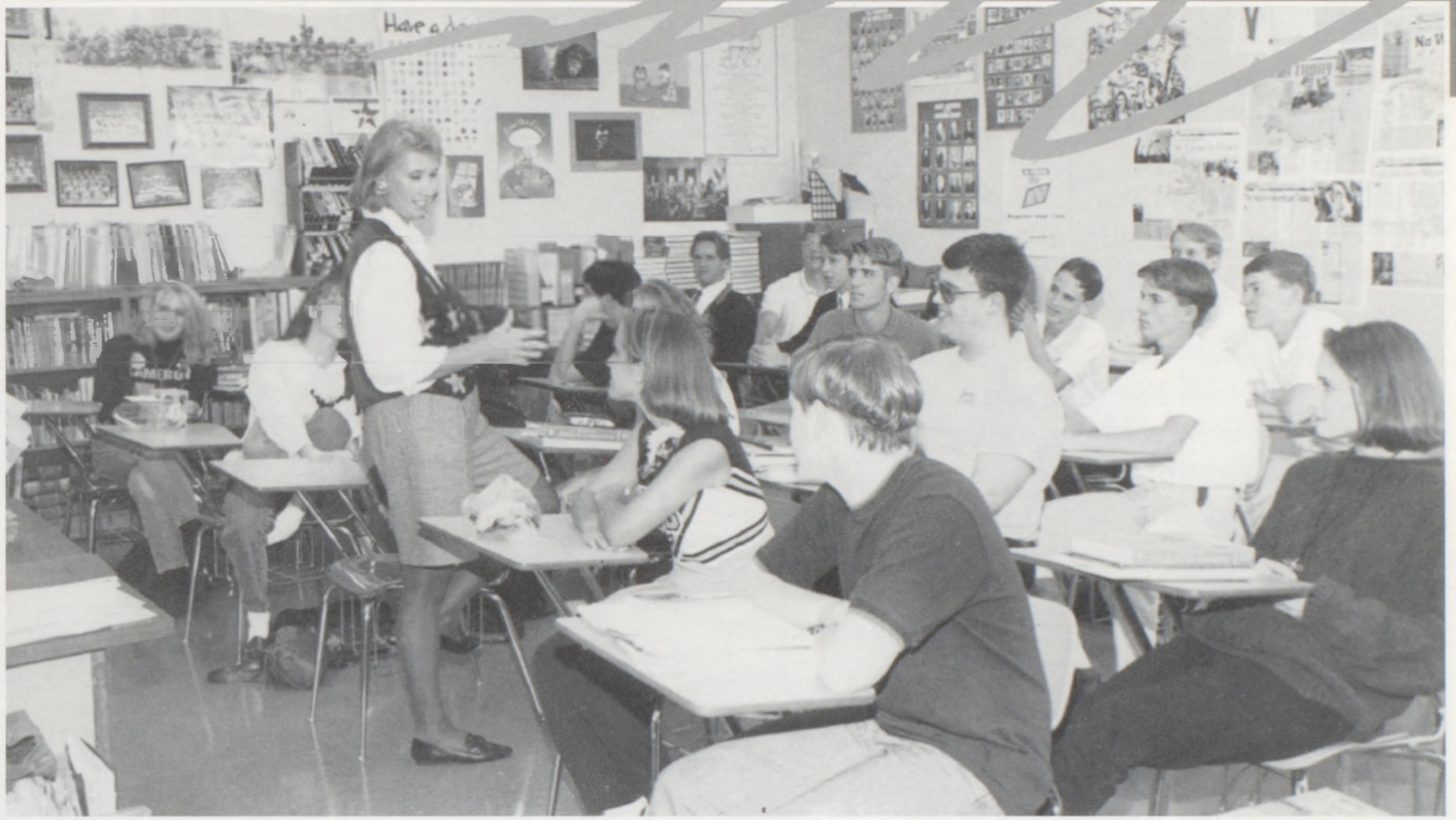

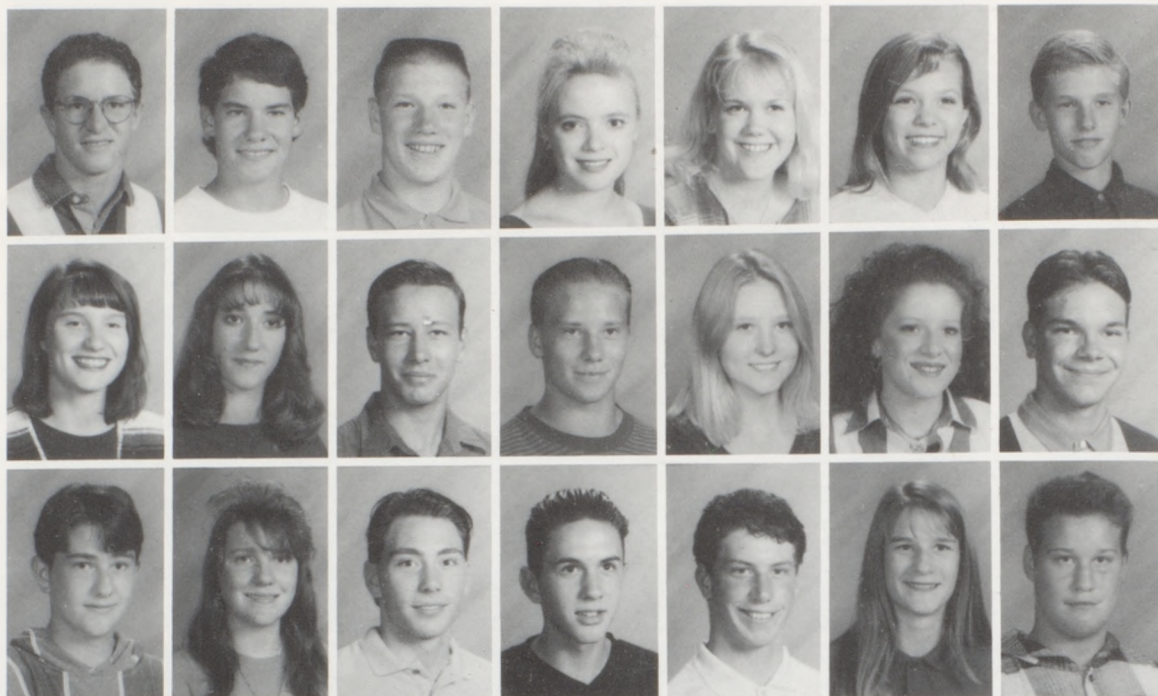
