Red Ribbon week started after Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Agent Enrique Camerena was killed. "Kiki" as he was known, worked as an undercover agent in Guadalajara, Mexico. On February 7, 1985, while undercover, Agent Camerena and his pilot were taken by drug cartel leaders. They were both found dead close to Angostura, Mexico.

The California State Parent-Teacher Association (DTA) created the Red Ribbon Campaign the next year. President Ronald Reagan made Red Ribbon Week a national campaign in 1988. Red Ribbon Week raises awareness of alcohol, tobacco, and other drug and violence prevention. Deople wear their red ribbons to show they are drug free and against violence.

## LロC AL Пews Brain Tumors

Karen Kemper passed away shortly after the beginning of the school year from complications related to her brain tumor. Kemper's case highlights the struggle many in Cameron face dealing with a rash of unexplained brain tumors. Residents have petitioned local, state, and federal authorities to ascertain the source of the problem. Even famed advocate Erin Brockavich has become involved.

Representatives of the City of Cameron, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, and the Centers for Disease Control have begun investigating, all asking for patience while they run test on samples of air, soil, and water. Possible sources include past industrial activities and material provided to farmers as fertilizer from a local tannery.

State Representative Jim Guest has proposed legislation that would require doctors to report all brain tumors to the state health department for accurate tracking of outbreaks like the one in Cameron. Currently, only cancerous tumors must be reported. To date, only benign tumors have been reported in Cameron. (Story compiled from news reports by KMBC and the Cameron CitizenObserver.)
